Design Criteria

A space for basketball, either outdoor or indoor, that accommodates players with disabilities: either wheelchair basketball, or a non-competitive, inclusive individual skills game with stations.

Wheelchair basketball: full-court or half-court (See 42), Basket height: 8'-6" Individual Skills Game Stations: minimum 6 stations, 1,6000 square feet. Basketball team game (3-on-3/5-on-5) or individual skills games. 50 feet from nearest adjacent building, 30 feet from curb. North-south orientation is preferred if located outdoors, level grade. Either outdoor (paved for wheelchair game), (grass, concrete or asphalt for individual skill games); indoor games (resilient flooring).
Fencing should be provided at a height sufficient to prevent errant balls from interfering with surroundings.

Seating or benches, with shade if outdoors, should be provided for spectators, along with water stations.
