• **Located in a land-locked, unbuildable triangle that resulted from subdivision of Twinbrook subdivision in the early 1950s. "Tweed Park" was rededicated by City and Lytton family as "Autre-St. Mary's Park"**

• **Two replacement markers within a partially enclosed iron fence, dated 1763 and 1819.**

• **One heavily damaged original marker has a date but no name.**

• **Several field stone markers and bricks.**



