







## Samuel Shoemaker's Will:

"And I do hereby dedicate for a graveyard for my family the following piece of ground containing 6 1/4 square perches, and shall never be appropriated to any other purpose, and there shall be at all times a convenient right of way to and from the same."

## **Ownership**



Samuel Shoemaker of Montgomery County is listed in "Genealogy of the Shoemaker Family of Cheltenham Penna" 1903 and the article mentions the family burying ground in "Friendship", Md.

The Samuel Shoemaker dwelling in Yorktown Village and the nearby cemetery, as dedicated in his will, are described in "Old Bethesda" by Doree Holman.


