- **Accessed behind a lot which formerly held the house, well, outbuilding, and shed of Lottie Crutchfield**
- **Grave markers are present but displaced, resting against trees, leaning against the fence, or laying on the ground**
- **105 burials are recorded according to Snowden Funeral Home. Only 33 have visible grave markers.**
- **Property is well kept, but requires constant maintenance to prevent vegetation overgrowth**

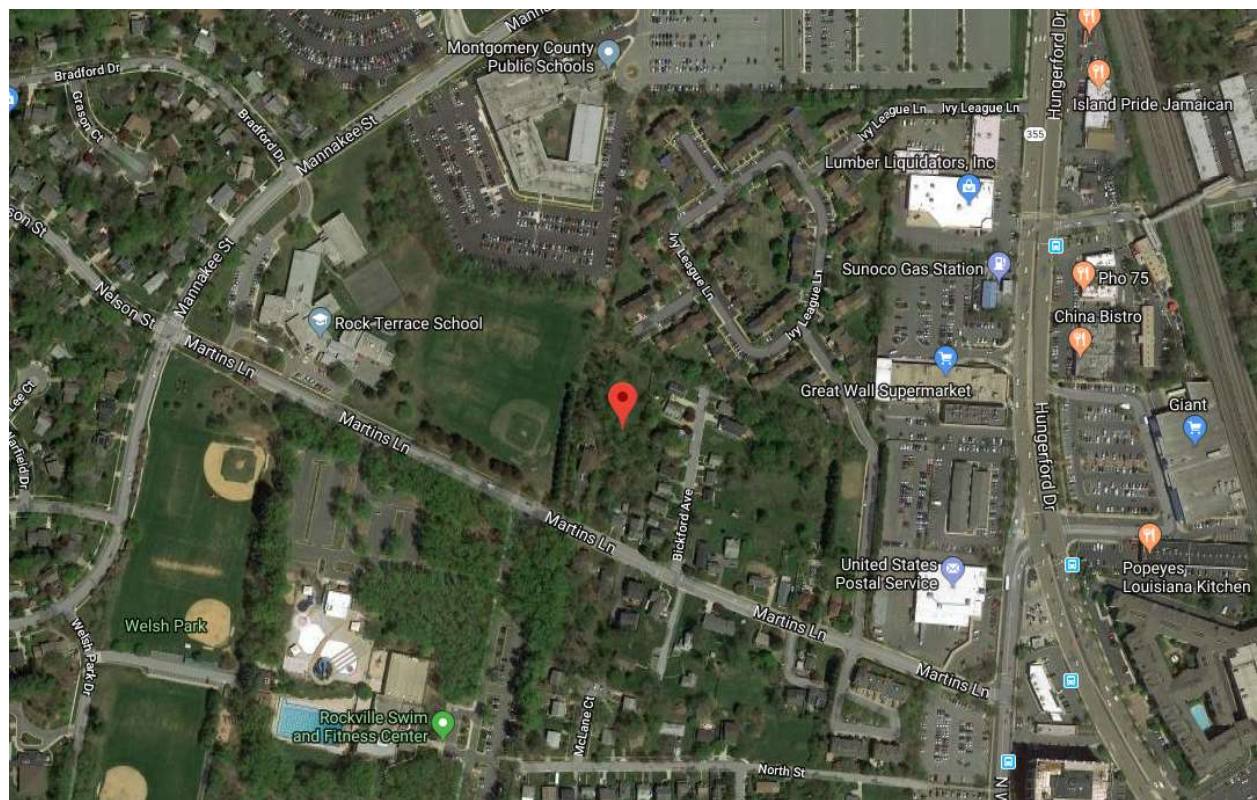
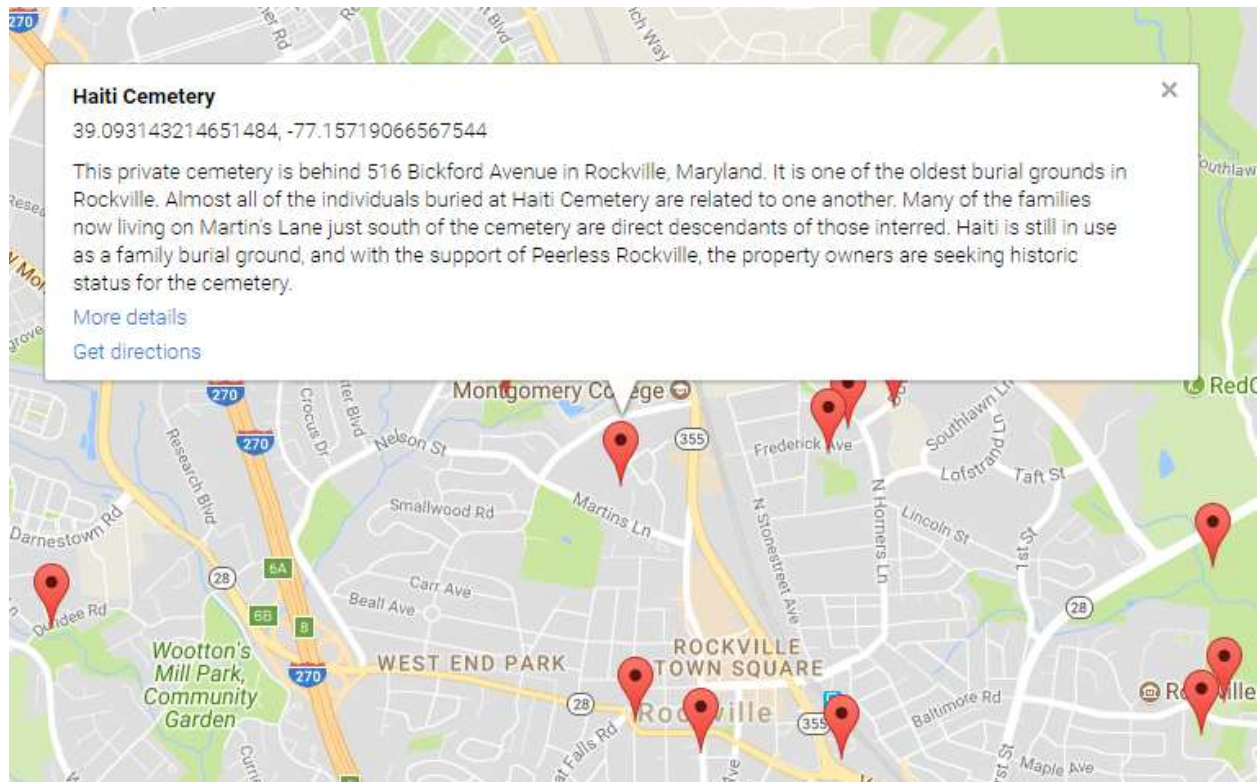

- Suggestions for follow-up:
- **Two iron gates around family plots are rusting and damaged from fallen tree limbs**
 - **GPR recommended to determine actual number of burials**
- Safety issues, invasive vegetation removal, fence removal/restoration, signage, trash, erosion, vandalism:
- **Several large tree limbs over grave markers**
- Anything of significance about this cemetery?
- **Oldest African American cemetery in Rockville, originally owned by Agatha and Dennis Smith and continuously owned by their descendants**
 - **Very first known cemetery in Rockville where formerly enslaved people could be buried**

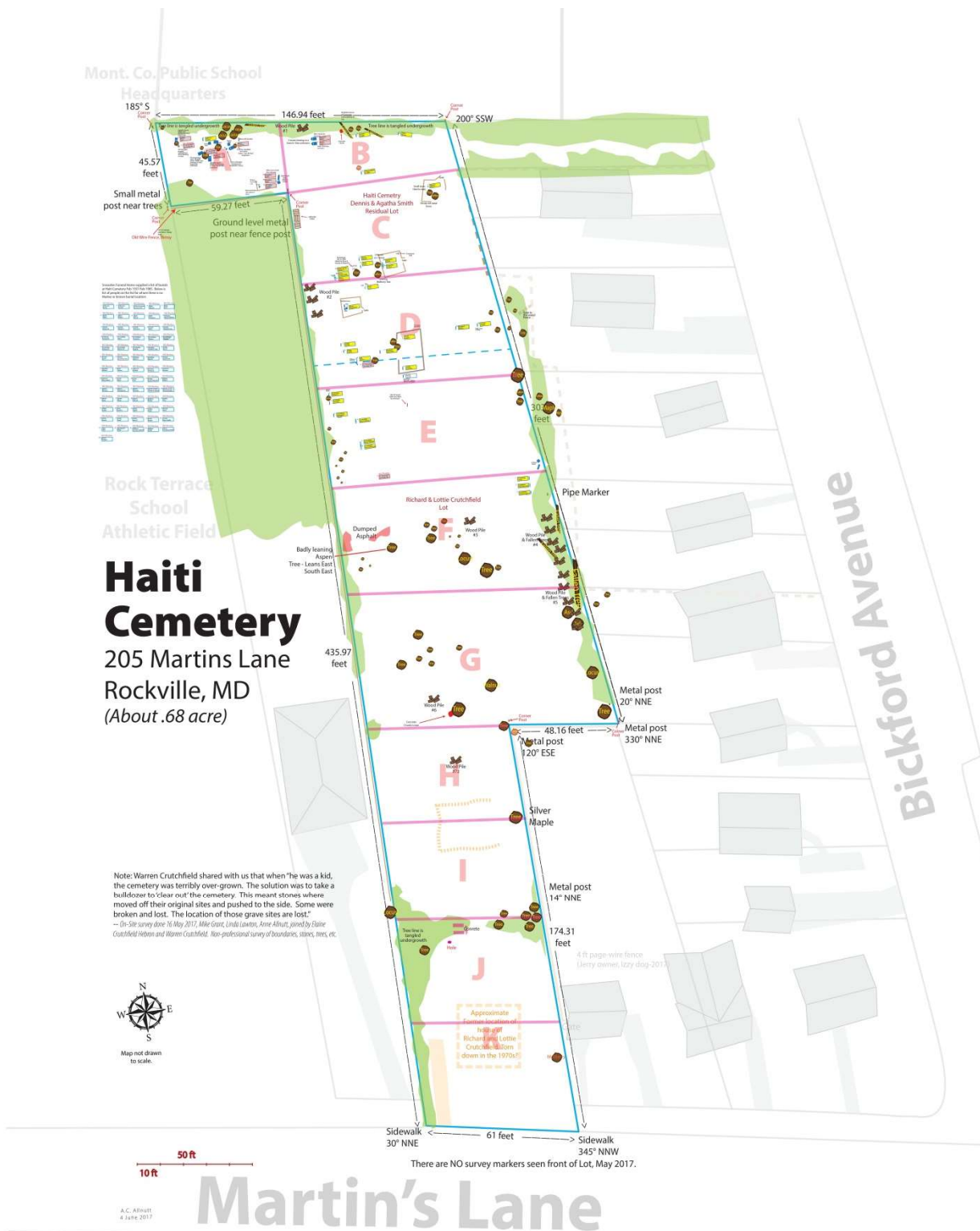

Mission and Vision

The current cemetery owner is Warren G. Crutchfield, who is 80 years old, is still maintaining the cemetery, mowing the lawn, pruning shrubs and trees, and chopping wood as of 2018. He is in need of help to care for and maintain the cemetery. Future priorities to be considered are a Conservation Assessment, comparison of burial list with funeral home records, IRS recognition and property tax exemption, Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR), grave marker restoration, and additional on-site interpretive signage. All of these steps relate directly to the owners' mission and vision, which is to restore the cemetery to a state where it can be well maintained, interpreted, and contribute to the appreciation of all who visit. Anchoring a new, healthy, formal organization with IRS status will help to preserve the cemetery, continue to garner community interest and support, sustain its caretakers, and set up a positive future for this historic burial ground. Warren and Elaine Crutchfield continue to make positive strides to use their resources to move towards a sustainable future for this important Rockville landmark.
