Some stones are in storage at the Little Bennett Creek Regional Park maintenance facility at 23700 Frederick Road (MD 355), Clarksburg.

About 20 years ago (1986) a farmer in the Clarksburg area moved the stones to the above facility for safe keeping. The stones had been at the edge of a field and one story is that he grew tired of plowing around them. There is no information on whether these stones were from a cemetery in that field or had been moved from another place.

There are four partial stones with names or initials, and a few other broken pieces. The names or initials are Gustavus Willson (born and died in February, 1811), J.C. (possibly John Clark), W.H. (maybe footstone for Wm Harris), Mr. Wm Harris (nephew and adopted son of a minister in Rathway, N.J., and Ann Clark (wife of John Clark, died 1810 at the age of 60).

From the names on the stones, it is not clear that these were from a Clark family cemetery, and the relationship of Gustavus Willson and Wm Harris to John Clark would not be easy to obtain.

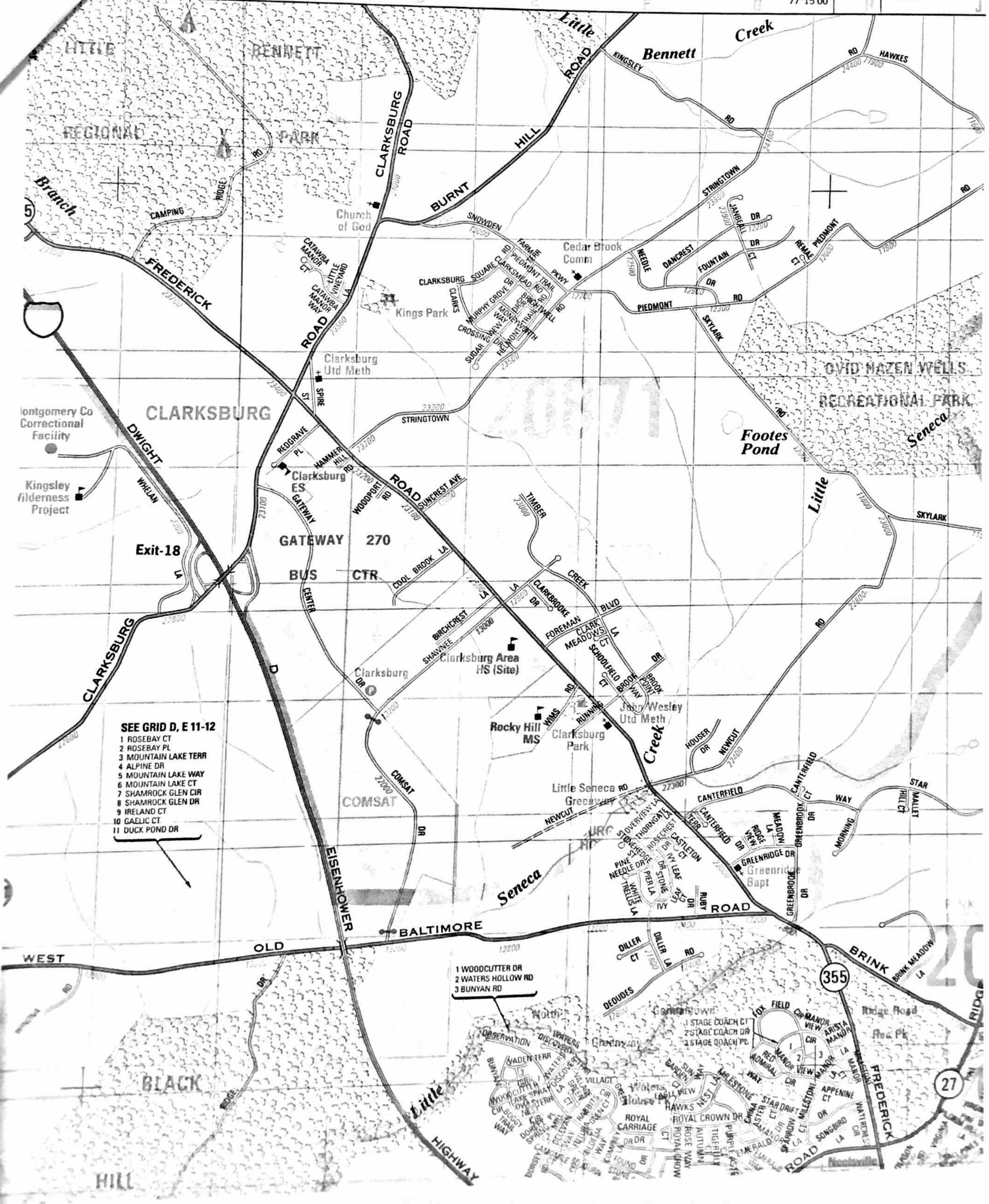
