


gomery Street on Monroe Street in Rockville. After crossing Cabin John Parkway and reaching Summit Apartments, you turn left and follow the paved road which becomes a bumpy, rutty road that would be impassable in winter weather.

Across A Field


When the road finally turns left to parallel 70S, directly across from the county buildings, you find an open field on your left.

In the field you see no marker--just tire tracks: two narrow pathways where the weeds have been smashed to the earth. On a hunch, you follow the weedy way up to a square clearing in the middle of the woody area.
