this right-of-way into the woods is probably the most direct path	to the cemetery(continued on attached page)

However, the right-of-way was so overgrown at the River Road entrance, our team took a separate route into an adjacent cornfield, entering the woods at its perimeter and using the GPS coordinates from the 2005 Montgomery County Cemetery Inventory to locate the site. Special thanks to Allen Driver and Nick Brame for leading the "Expedition".

There are no signs or fences or even a clearing that would cue a visitor to the site. The cemetery site is approximately (a guess) 50 yards by 50 yards with mature trees and a blanket of groundcover (group consensus was periwinkle, a popular ground cover in cemeteries for its low maintenance). The headstones do not appear to be arranged in any specific order. Most of the headstones appear to be of Seneca sandstone. Some stones have been shaped (half-round top was common) while others remain natural. Some are hand inscribed, while others have no writing (or the writing has been lost to weathering and time). Some stones appear to have been propped up against trees at some point in time (some of the trees appear to be younger that death date on the stone).

Determining the number of burials is very difficult. Six headstones have clear inscriptions of names and/or dates. One stone has a cross inscribed and another stone has what appear to markings that look intentional but are illegible. There at least a dozen more stones of significant size which likely mark a grave, but are unmarked. And several smaller stones, most of which are in their natural shape, that may mark a grave or be footstones.

- Before you begin, create a folder in your photo app on your mobile device. Name the folder to match the ID number of that cemetery, i.e., 059 or 254. Each cemetery you are assigned should have its own folder. All photos should be stored in this folder.
- Please take a variety of photos that capture the proximity from the main road, size, and vicinity of the burial site. Move in a clockwise direction through the cemetery to capture your movement chronologically.
- If your mobile device has a panoramic function, take two panoramic photos from the **center** of the cemetery. Establish where true North is and take one panoramic from West-North-East and the second from East-South-West.
- List the time and date of each photograph and include the direction you are facing.

Photo 2 taken toward the center of the cemetery from the cemetery main entrance, gate, or first boundary you come to.
Photo 3 panoramic taken from the center of the cemetery, starting from West to North to East.
Photo 4 panoramic taken from the center of the cemetery, starting from East to South to East.

If you have any extra time and would like to photograph some or all of the gravestones, please do so. Remember not to physically touch, move, or clean the stones.
