Duley owned since 1830. In 1957, ^{his father} sold all
but house on a few acres to developer.

Developer to get that at his death, which occurred
in 1977.

After main part of farm ^{was sold}, his father fenced off
part of what he retained for his cows
to use. This included the cem. Cows
ruined stones.

He remembers stones for children with the
last names of Robinson. Also field stone
markers, which he thinks may have
been slaves. Does not remember any
markers for adults.
