DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Little remains of this ca. 1900 community. The old store and post office burned a while back, but the stone foundation can be seen at Avery Rd. and Dimes Rd. The schoolhouse was located up the road, but also has been gone awhile. However, a rotted, sagging, one-story gable-facade house is visible on the Penn property. At the intersection of Avery and Southlawn is the old two-story, frame Magruder House-this has a steep "A" roof, three bays on the main (west) facade, and dates from about 1890. It was probably associated with the old Methodist Church, that sits in the yard here. This latter building is an unpainted, one-story country church of very plain design. The entrance is in the west gable facade, and the siding is German. There are several smaller, frame house, back on Dimes Rd., that remain from the old Negro community there.

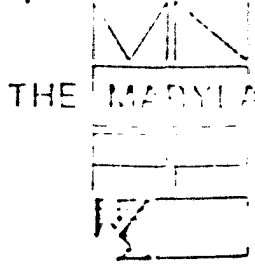

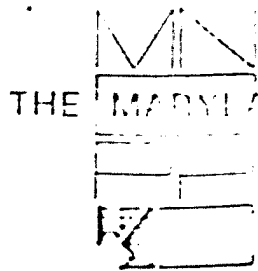

Pursuant to an Act of the General Assembly, the following Articles of Incorporation were recorded October 8th, A. D. 1892, to wit:

Certificate of Incorporation of the Free Methodist Church of Avery Lodge, Montgomery County, Maryland.

At a meeting of the Society known as the Free Methodist Class, worshipping at Barnsley School house, Montgomery County, Maryland, held at Avery Lodge Camp Grounds on July 20, 1892, the following resolutions were adopted as a Charter:

First This Church shall be known as the Free Methodist Church of Avery Lodge, Montgomery County, Maryland.

Second The Board of Trustees shall consist of five (5) persons, exclusive of the Minister, who by virtue of the laws of the State of Maryland, in such case made and provided by virtue of his ministry, shall be a member of said Corporation, each of which in a five Trustees shall be not less than twenty one years of age, and a majority of whom shall be members of said Church.

Third The Incorporators or first Board of Trustees of said Church shall consist of the following named persons, to wit: Edward Briggs, Thomas Ray, George F. Ray, Crittenden Ray and Edward Ray, in connection with the Minister aforesaid.

Fourth The said Board of Trustees shall be elected annually on the first Thursday of April in each year, by the members of said Church over twenty one (21) years of age, at a meeting hereof held if possible in the house of worship of said Church, and called in accordance with custom, usage and discipline of the religious denomination of which said Church forms a part, and that if for any reason such a meeting can not be held, on the date named herein, the said meeting may be held at any time thereafter as shall be determined upon, and called in accordance with said usage, custom and discipline, and if there shall be a failure to elect said Trustees at the time named, the Trustees holding shall continue in office until their successors are elected.
