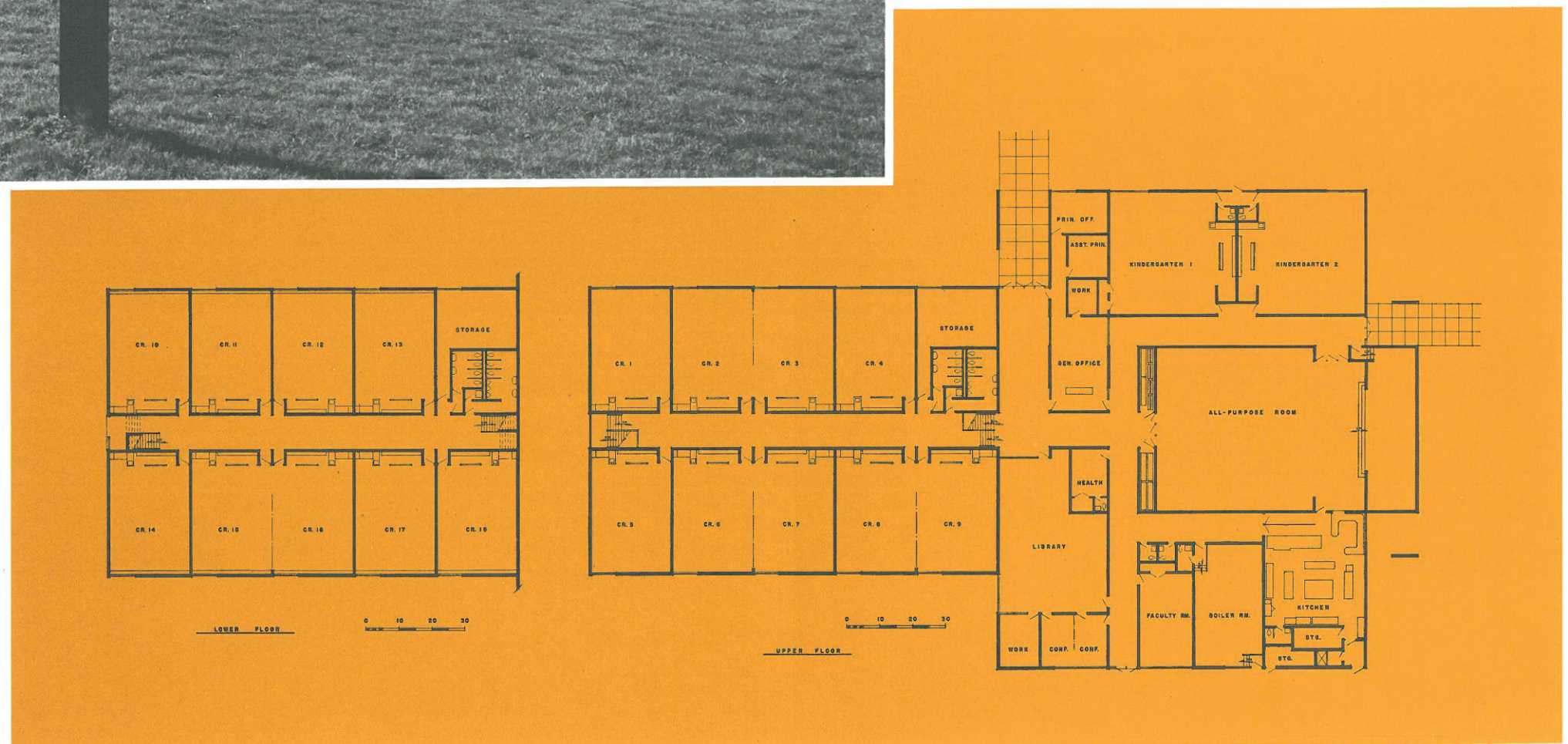

Spring Mill Elementary School—Montgomery County, Maryland

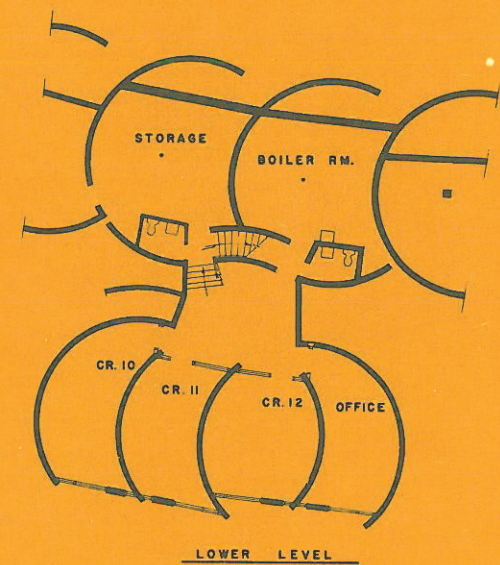
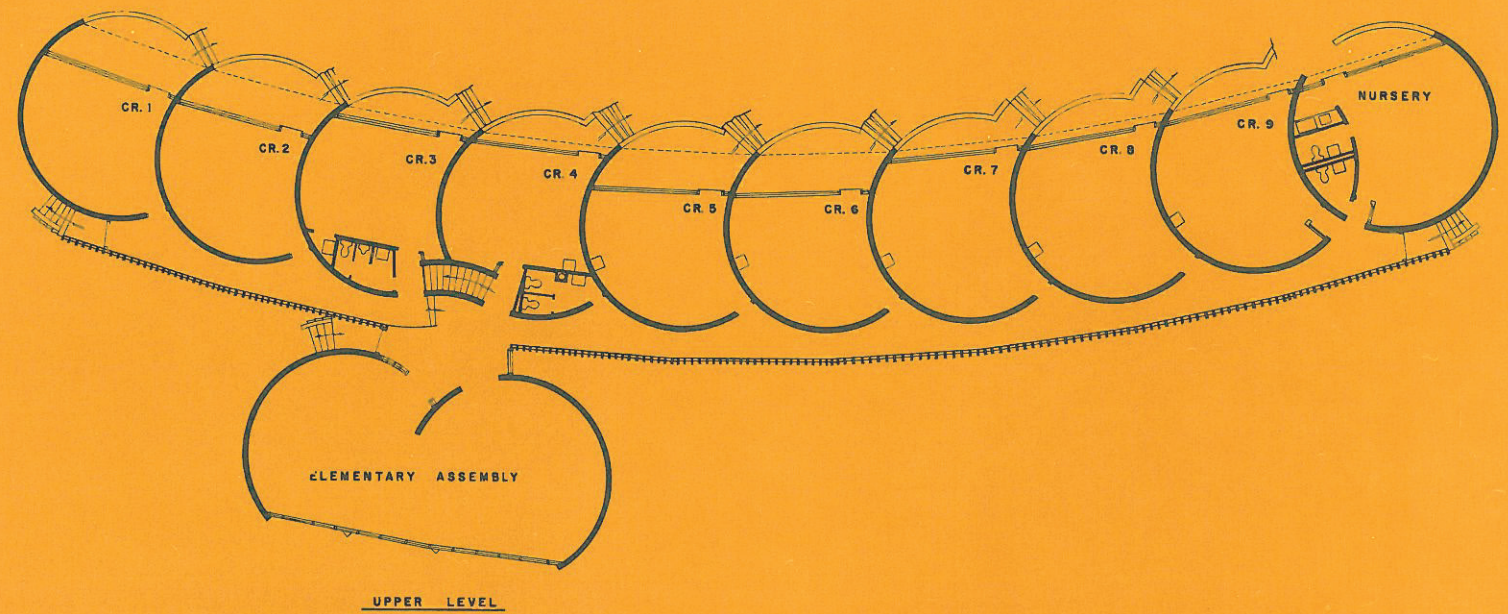

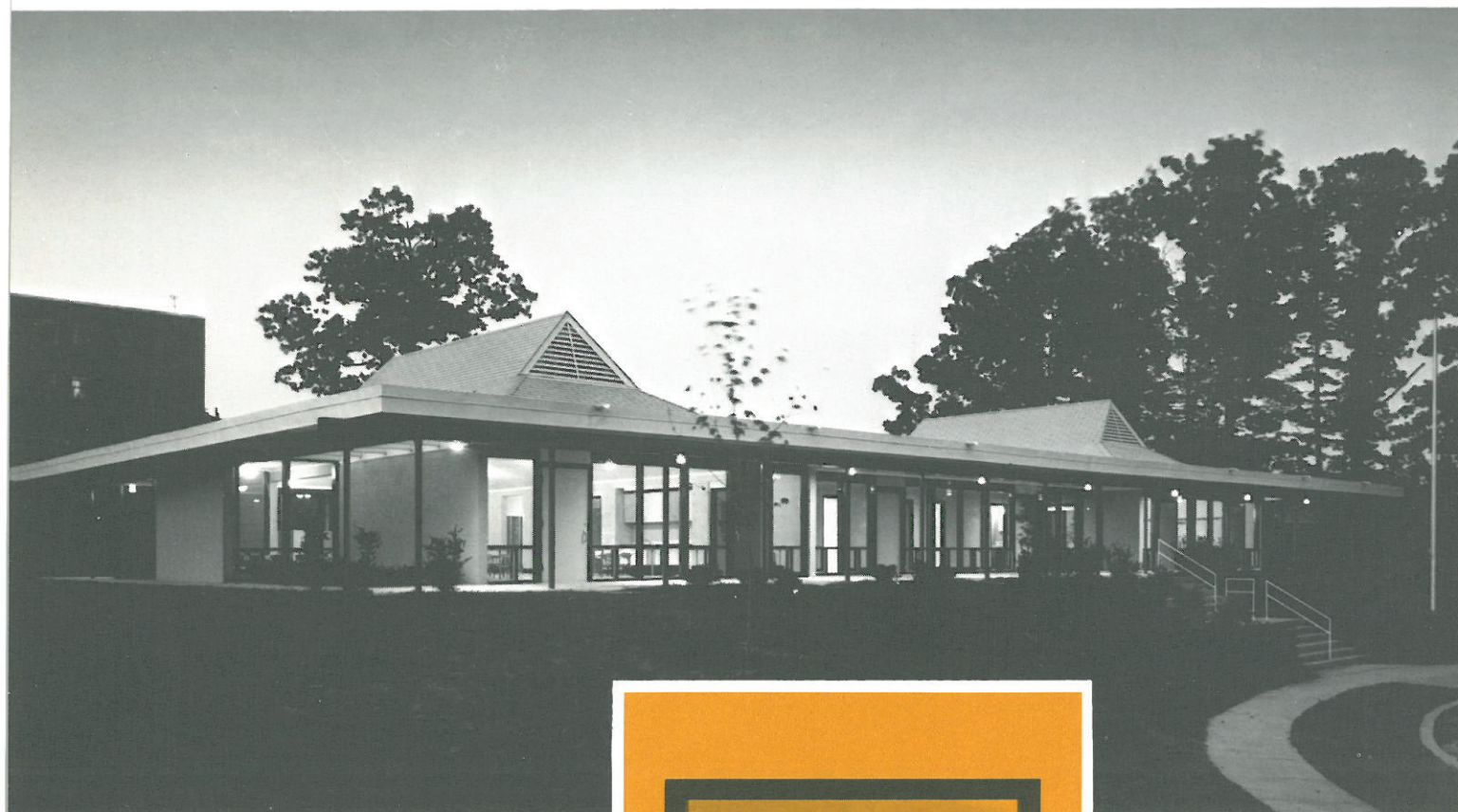


Springhill Lake Elementary School—Prince George's County, Maryland

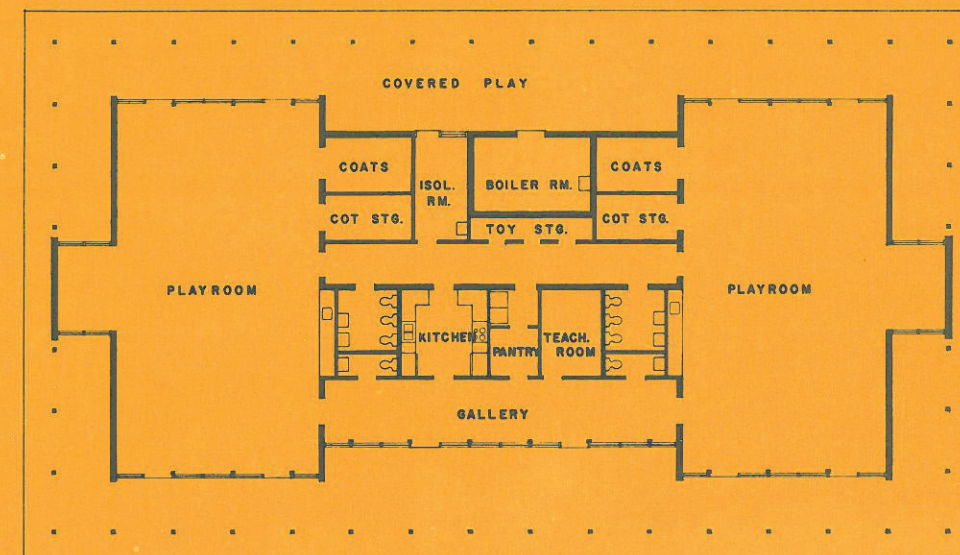


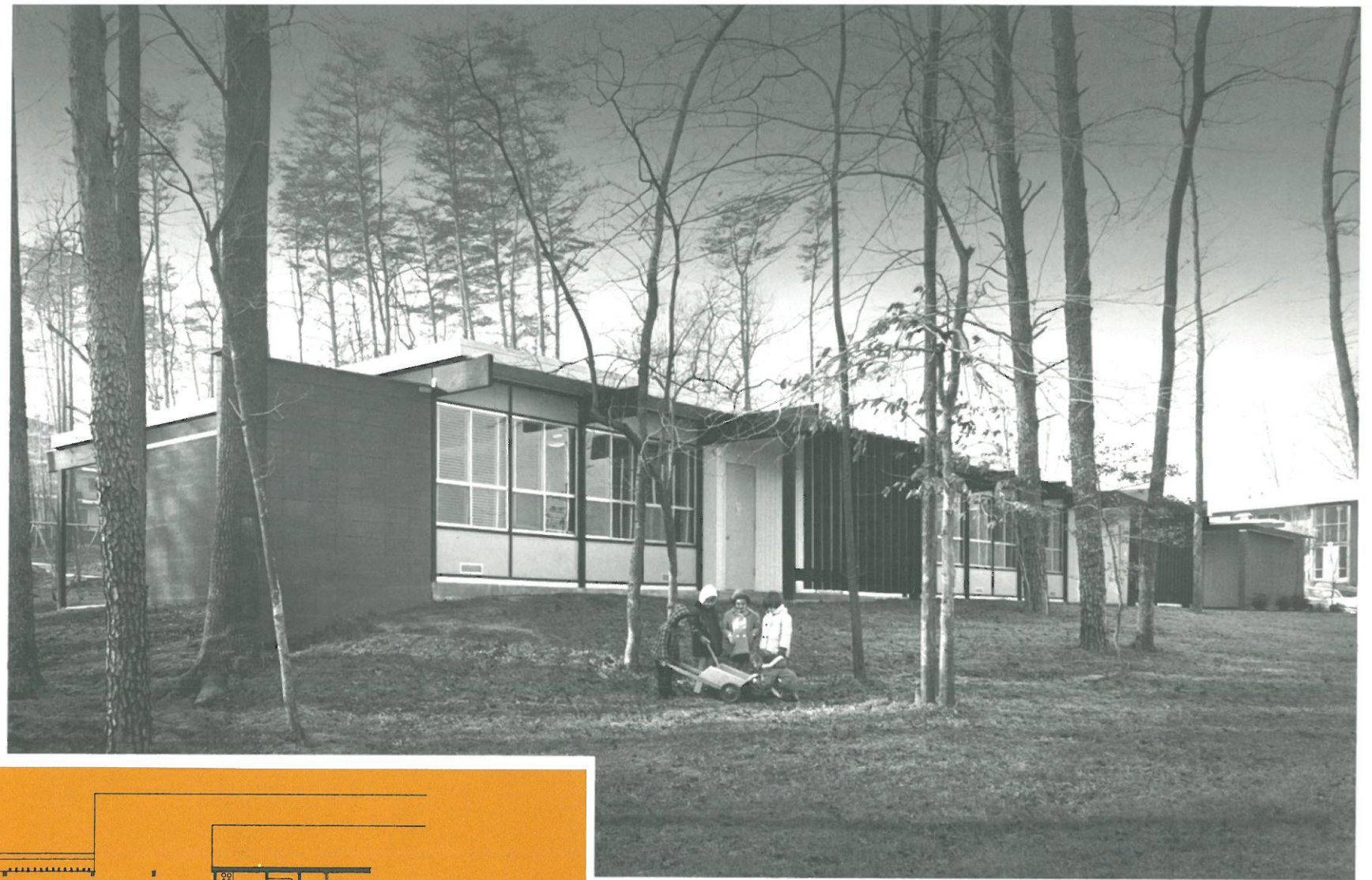

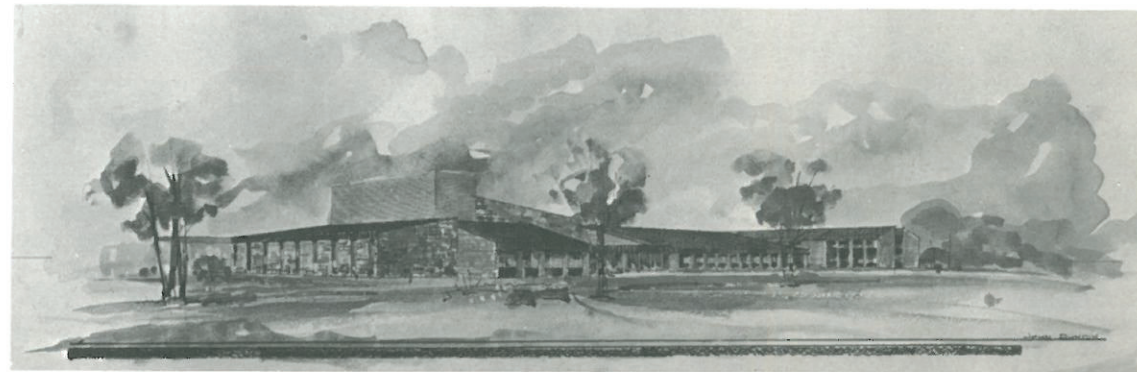
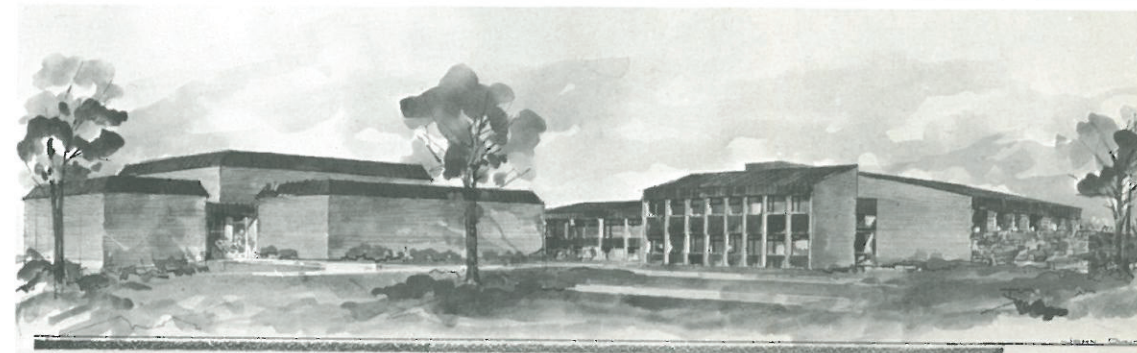
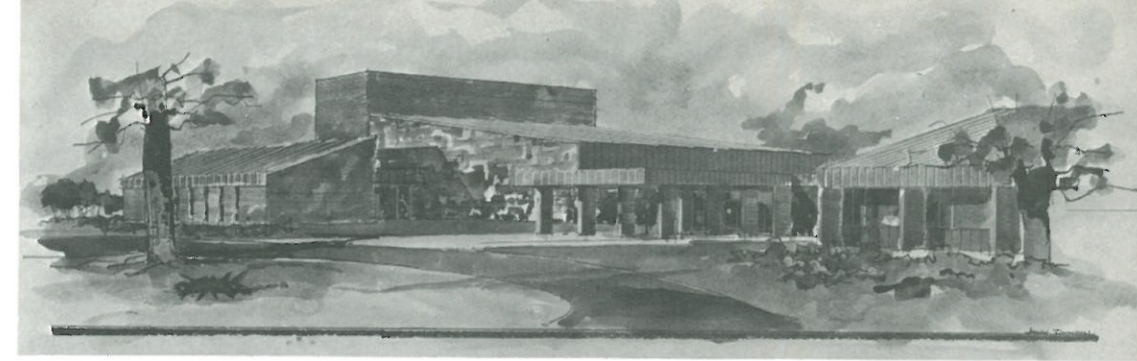




Site and Landscape Plan: Jewish Community Center and Hebrew Home for the Aged, Greater Washington, D. C.

Hebrew Home For The Aged.

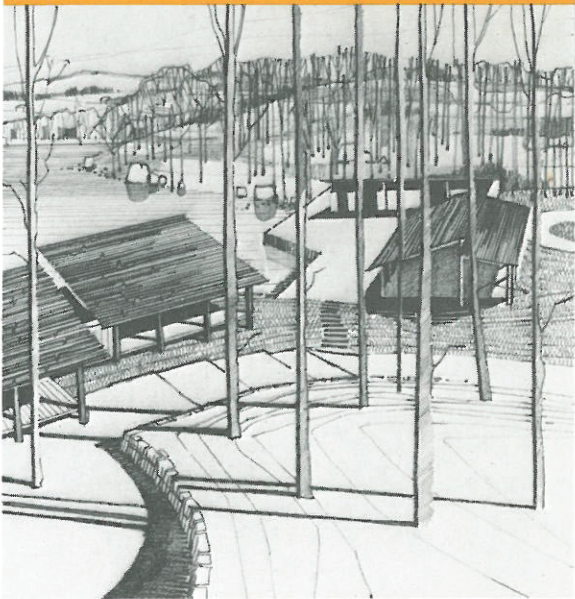
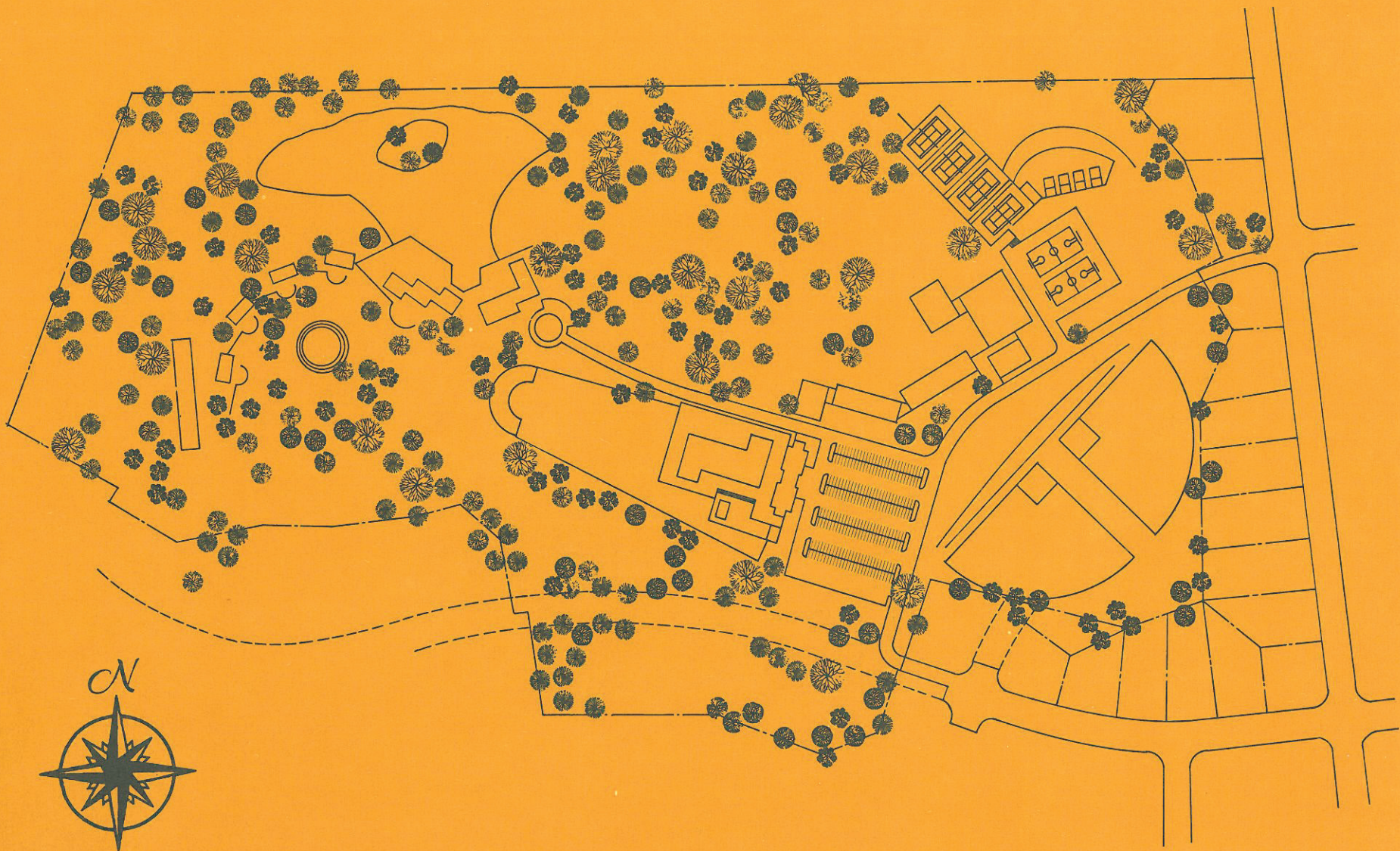

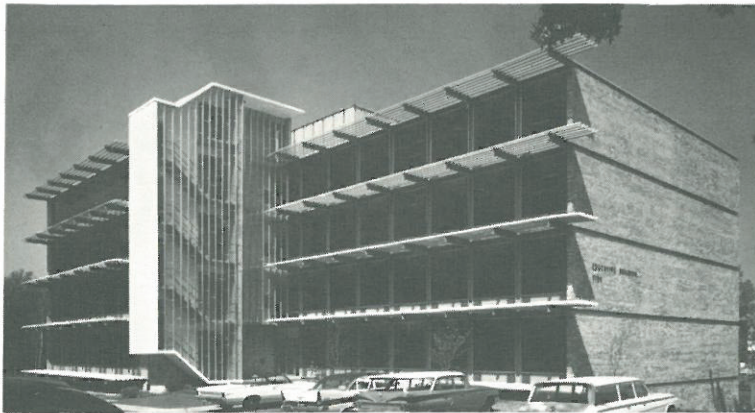
Jewish Community Center

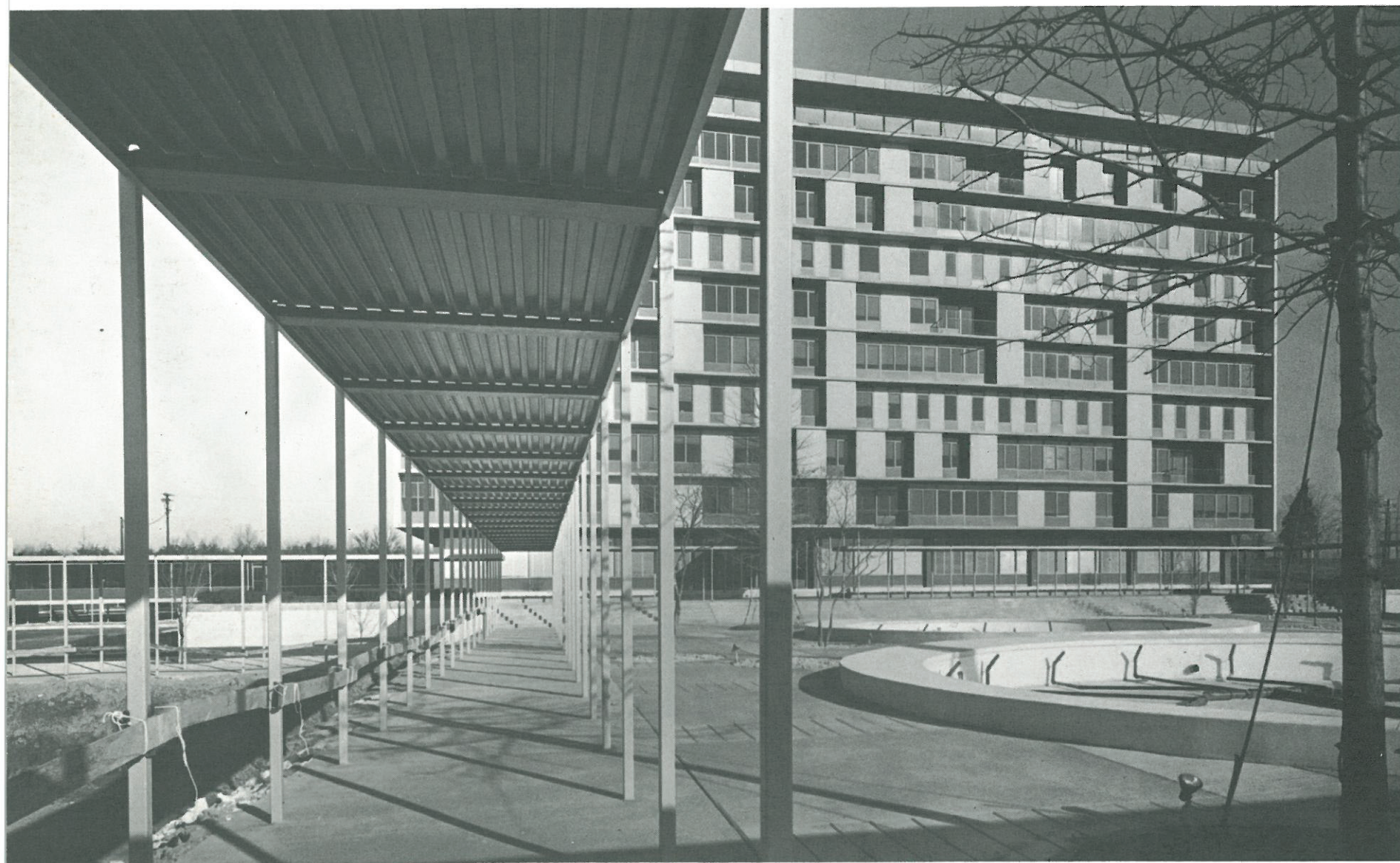

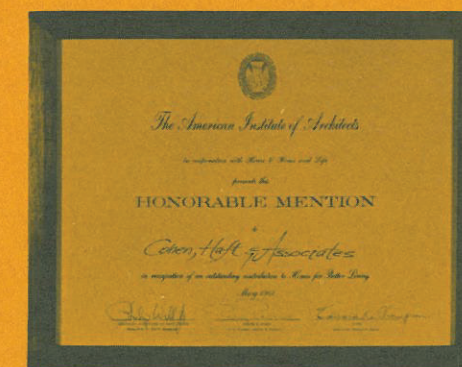
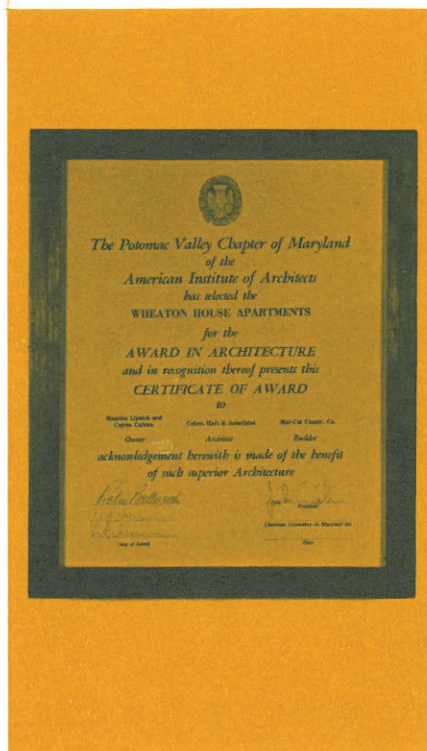


Springhill Lake is a 5,000 unit apartment city planned around a lake which was created out of a flood valley.

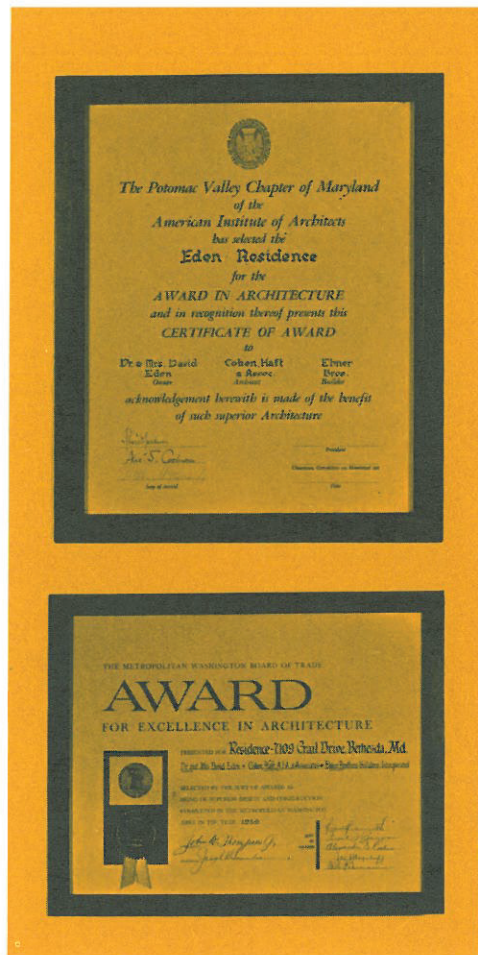

JACK C. COHEN — Registered Architect

Was graduated Cum Laude from Catholic University with a Bachelor of Architectural Engineering. He is a member of the Sigma XI Honorary Fraternity.
