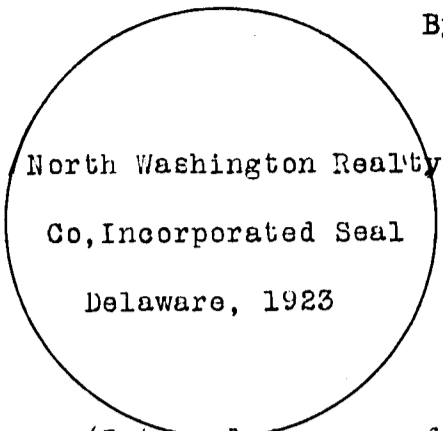

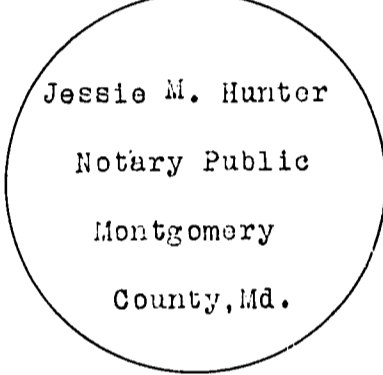

1-29-24 This deed made this 8th day of October in the year nineteen hundred and twenty three by The Washington Diocesan Organization of the Girls' Friendly Society in America, corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the District of Columbia.

Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the sum of \$10 the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the said The Washington Diocesan Organization of the Girls's Friendly Society in America, a corporation as aforesaid, does hereby Grant bargain sell and convey unto William H. Hough of the said District of Columbia, all those tracts parts of tracts pieces or parcels of land situate lying and being in Montgomery County in the state of Maryland and described as follows, to wit:-

First: Part of a tract of land called "Fulford" and part of a tract of land called "Addition to Charley Forest" or by whatever name or names the same may be known or called, and contained within the metes and bounds courses and distances, to wit:

Beginning at a stone planted at the intersection of the northern line of a tract of land containing ten acres sold by William H. Farquahar to Henry Pierce (now owned by the heirs of Mary G. Tyson) with the "Commission Division line" and running thence with said division line north six and threefourths degrees west fifty three and one half perches to the
