 This Indenture made this seventeenth day of August eighteen hundred and twenty five between Benedict Joy of Frederick County and State of Maryland of the one part and James M. Thrift of Montgomery County and State aforesaid of the other part witnesseth that the said Benedict Joy for and in consideration of the sum one thousand dollars current money of Maryland to him in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, enfeoffed and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, enfeoff and confirm unto the said James M. Thrift his heirs and assigns forever all that tract of land called Aix la Chappelle containing two hundred & thirty two acres of land more or less lying & being in Montgomery County and State aforesaid, beginning at two bounded white oaks the beginning of Chestnut Ridge and running thence South twenty seven degrees East one hundred and seventy five perches, South thirty two degrees West twelve perches and one quarter of a perch to a bounded Spanish Oak the beginning tree of a tract of land called Nothing Venture Nothing yet, then reversed with the given line of said land, South forty eight and three fourths of a degree West five perches to the given line of a tract of land called Griffiths oversight, then with it North fourteen degrees West four perches to the end of the first line of a tract of land called Exchange, then with said land South seventy eight degrees West thirty six perches, South fifty one degrees West forty nine perches and one quarter of a perch to the forty second line of a tract of land called the second resurvey on the friend in need, thence reversed with said line South forty six degrees East one hundred and fourteen perches and one quarter of a perch to the end of the forty first line of said land, then South twenty five degrees East sixteen perches to the twentieth line of the resurvey on the friend in need, then North fifty five degrees East fourteen perches to the end of the nineteenth line of said land, then South twenty five degrees East five perches, to the third line of Nothing Venture Nothing yet, then North sixty eight degrees East sixteen perches to the third line of Chestnut Ridge, then with said line South fifty six degrees East four perches to the end of the third line of Charles G.
