9. Description: This $2\frac{1}{2}$ story, three bay by four bay, L-shaped frame house sits close to West Montgomery Avenue facing north. Built on brick foundations, it has olive green novelty siding. There are two-over-two double-hung windows throughout the house. There is a 2 story, 3-sided angle bay window on the west elevation; there are 2 dormer windows on the south and three dormer windows on the north elevation. The roof is mansard in style, surmounted by a low hipped roof. The mansard slope is visible only on the north and south elevations. There is an interior stove chimney centered over the front section and an interior chimney near the south end of the ell.

There are porches at the front and rear of the house. The rear porch is two-stories, with jigsawed palings and two wooden chamfered posts supporting 10. Significance: the shed roof.

The Speare house is significant for its architecture, adding to the representative Victorian styles which may be seen along West Montgomery Avenue. Rockville since its designation as the County seat in 1776 has always been a prime location for those of the legal profession. In 1877 Judge James B. Henderson purchased land on West Montgomery Avenue and sold half of it to his friend Hattersley W. Talbott. Both had fine houses constructed for them the following year; they shared a windmill on Falls Road. During Talbott's ownership, from 1877 to 1890, he was prominent and active in Democratic Party politics on the local and State levels. Mr. Talbott pros-

pered in the legal profession and was able to construct and move into his new, larger house at 100 Forest Avenue in 1891.

208 West Montgomery Avenue was sold for \$5,000 to the Stephen B. Lyddanes, who owned and operated a butcher shop in town. Mrs. Ethel Speare, the present occupant, is a Lyddane daughter. The City of Rockville purchased the house in 1969.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two and a half story, three bay by four bay, L-shaped frame house, sits close to West Montgomery Avenue facing north.

Built on brick foundations, Speare House has olive green novelty siding. The north (front) porch has a half-hipped roof supported by four wooden chamfered posts. The north (front) door is glass and wooden paneled and is surmounted by a single light transom. There is a two story porch on the east elevation, south (rear) ell. At the first level two wooden chamfered posts support the second level. The second level has jigsawed palings and two wooden chamfered posts which support the shed roof. There are two wooden paneled doors on the east elevation. The northeast corner door, however, has no steps leading up to it.

There are two-over-two double hung windows throughout the house. They are generally flanked by olive green wooden louvered shutters. On the north elevation at the first level, the two windows are longer than usual and extend down to the porch floor. On the west elevation there is a two story, three-sided angle bay window. There are two dormer windows on the south elevation and three dormer windows on the north elevation.

The Speare House has a mansard roof surmounted by a low hipped roof. The mansard slope is visible only on the north and south elevations. There is an interior stove chimney centered over the north (front) section and an interior chimney near the south (end) of the ell.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Rockville since its designation as Montgomery County's seat of government in 1776 has always been a prime location for those of the legal profession. Judge James B. Henderson of the Montgomery County Circuit Court in 1877 purchased 141 square perches (0.88125 acre) of land on West Montgomery Avenue just inside the City limits for $$400^{-1}$ and sold almost half of that to his friend and fellow lawyer Hattersley W. Talbott². Both landowners had fine houses constructed for them the following year³, as well as a windmill they shared. Hattersley and Laura Talbott kept a barn and cows in the field across Falls Road.

During Talbott's ownership, from 1877 to 1890, he was prominent and active in Democratic Party politics on the local and State levels. Mr. Talbott prospered in the legal profession and was able to construct and move into his new, larger house at 100 Forest Avenue in 1891.

208 West Montgomery Avenue was sold for \$5,000 to the Stephen B. Lyddanes⁴, who owned and operated a butcher shop in town. Mrs. Ethel Speare, the present occupant, is a Lyddane daughter. The City of Rockville purchased the house in 1969⁵.
