

Dear Mr. Mellon:

In accordance with our understanding, I am enclosing you a photocopy of a letter under the date of December 29, 1928, addressed to Rev. Philip A. Dales, St. John's Rectory, Olney, Maryland, who at that time served as rector of St. Bartholomew's Church at Laytonsville, Maryland, and also a copy of the extract from the will of Lucy A. Worthington, which is attached to the letter that was in the files of our Treasurer.

The iron fence which is around this cemetery has rusted through at the connections at the corner posts and the entire lower part of the fence has become so rusted that it is a mere sieve. Consequently, the fence does not prevent the cattle which is in the open field from breaking it down and they run over the graveyard.

This requires a capital improvement of a new fence which we are informed will run about \$4.00 a foot. There are approximately 100 feet of fence which will make the cost approximately \$400.00. It is our intention, if agreeable with the Treasurer's office, to secure two bids for replacing this fence and submit same to the Treasurer of the Diocese for approval as a capital investment in this cemetery. We will thank you if you will advise with reference to this project.
