#### "GREENWOOD CEMETERY"


The "GREENWOOD" cometery is located inside the southwestern part of the yard. The cemetary is surreunded by a field stone fence 4 feet high and 50 feet square. Mr. Heward Craver informed me, that he and his brethers, Simon and Allen Bewie Craver hauled the field stones from as eld church in Brockeville on North Street for the davis family. The wall was constructed from these stones and a layer of granite slabs from Verment or New Hampshire were placed on top to form a cap. 5 Millstones from the "GREENWOOD" mill were placed on the South side to provide stops to a walkway through the center. The graves were en raised ground next to the pathway. At this time 16 gravesites can be lecated within the cemetary. American bexweeds were placed in two short rews en both sides of the main monument and myrtle was to cover the ground area. A large helly tree is located in the Southeastern section of the cemetary. Mr. Heward Craver teld me, that the Davis family had a large white deg, such as a Newfoundland type, and when the deg died it was buried in the Seutheastern corner. Mrs. Mary Davis Rad two halves of millstone placed in the outside wall facing the Westminister Pike, when she had the walls last repaired. Mrs. Mary Davis, the last desendent left a sum of meney, believed to be \$1,000., in trust with St. John's Episcopal Church in Olney, Maryland to provide perpetual care for the cemetary. 

Bowie, of Laltimore, Maryland.
