Benjamin Burdett d. Jan. 16, 1834 aged 68 years Elizabeth Burdett d. April 8, 1868 aged 70 years and 1 month.

Ascording to previous survey by Anne Braun on June 15, 2003, three additional Stones found:

James Burdett b. Jan 18, 1841 d. Feb. 23, 1871 aged 30 yrs James Gue d. Feb. 7, 1846 Margaret Purdum Gue b. Jan 8, 1796 d. Mar. 12, 1861 Wife of James.

At that time, the cemetery was neglected. On Ms. Braun tacked to the owner, who said That one of the relatives of the deceased used to visit annually, but no longer comes. There owner tacked about cleaning it up, but this has not been done.

There are likely more stones, but site is too overgrown to investigate.

In Damascus, from the intersection of Highway 27 (Ridge Road) and Bethesda Church Road, turn on Bethesda Church Road and go 2.5 miles west until you hit Purdum Road. Turn on Purdum and go south about .25 miles until you reach 27100 Purdum which is a farm. Turn there and go up the driveway. The cemetery is in a soybean field about 150-200 yards from the driveway.

This is a small neglected cemetery. The day I was up there the owner said that there used to be one of the relatives that came up there and visited each year however she does not come up anymore. His son took me and showed me where the headstones where. They are talking about cleaning this one up next fall afyer the weather cools down. The Gues and Burdettes are buried there. There are probally more graves or headstones but because of the overgrowth you cannot find them.


