At the request of William Oneale, Benjamin Mackall Charles Perry, Charles Beatty  
Henry Brookes Benjamin Edwards and Zadok Magruder Trustees of the poor for  
Montgomery County the following deed was recorded this 30<sup>th</sup> day of June 1789 "Davit"  
This Indenture made this 25<sup>th</sup> day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand  
seven hundred and eighty nine Between Thomas Wilson of the City of Annapolis in  
Anne Arundel County and State of Maryland of the one part and William Oneale  
Benjamin Mackall, Charles Perry, Charles Beatty, Henry Brookes, Benjamin Edwards  
and Zadok Magruder Trustees for the poor in and for Montgomery County in the  
State aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said Thomas Wilson for and  
in Consideration of the sum of one hundred and twelve pounds Ten shillings current  
money to him in hand paid the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and him-  
-self therewith fully satisfied and paid hath given granted bargained sold  
alien released enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant barg-  
-ain sell alien release enfeoff and confirm unto them the said William Oneale Benjamin  
Mackall Charles Perry Charles Beatty Henry Brookes Benjamin Edwards and  
Zadok Magruder Trustees as aforesaid and their Successor Trustees of the poor  
for Montgomery County forever part of a tract or parcel of Land lying and being  
Within the County aforesaid called the rowney on part of Exchange and New ex-  
-change enlarged originally granted to a certain James Dick Beginning for said part at  
a Stone planted at the end of Eighty six perches on the nineteenth line of the whole ori-  
-ginal tract called Exchange and new exchange enlarged, the said Stone being distant  
on a North thirty degree East Course thirty two Links of the Chain from a large  
forked Chegnut tree marked with six notches then with the said nineteenth line  
revers a North twenty degree West twenty three perches to a Stone planted at the  
end of twenty two Links of the Chain on a North sixty three degree West Course  
from a White oak marked with six notches then South twenty five degrees  
East sixty four perches to a Stone planted Between two maple trees each mar-  
-ked with six notches then North fifty seven degrees East forty three perches to a  
Stone then South forty degrees East fifty eight perches to a Stone then South fifty five  
degrees East thirty perches to a Stone then South forty eight degree West thirty three  
perches and one half perch to a Stone planted at the end of the first line of a tract of  
Land called come by chance, then with said Land North eighty six degrees West one hundred  
and nine perches to a Stone planted where the said line intersects the before mentio-
