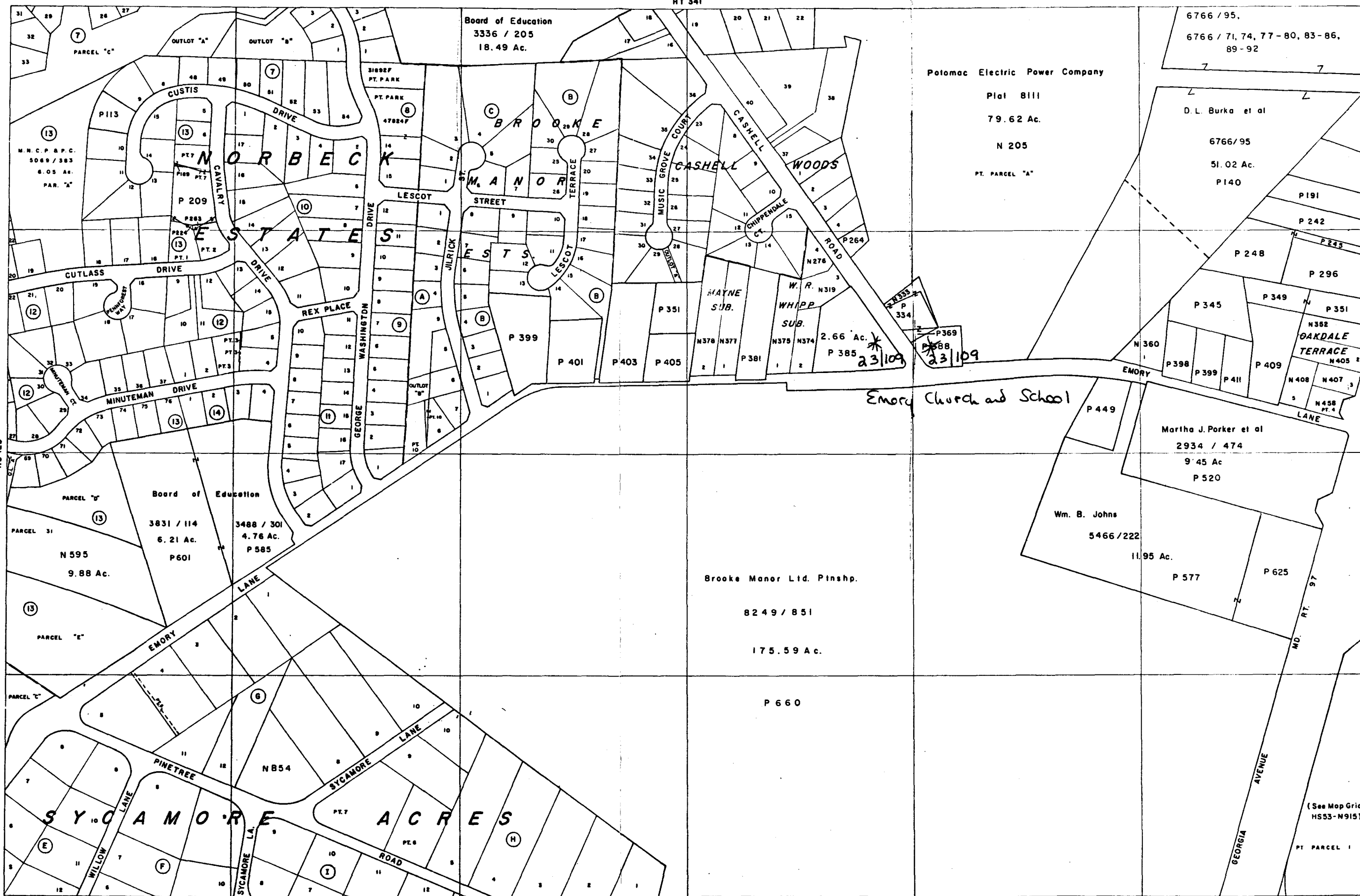

The Emory Church and School property is currently the site of two residential structures, both of which were built in the second quarter of the 20th century. The two independent houses are located on adjacent lots at the intersection of Emory Lane and Cashell Road, and on the site of the original Emory Methodist Church and Emory School, later known as Oakdale School. Although they occupy the site of the original church and school buildings, these residential structures have no other associations with Emory Methodist Church, and no architectural significance in their own right. The property does not meet the requirements for historic designation based on the criteria stated in Section 24A-3 of the *Historic Preservation Ordinance*.

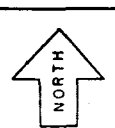

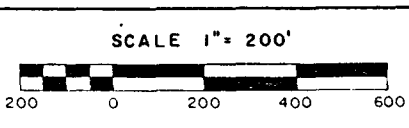

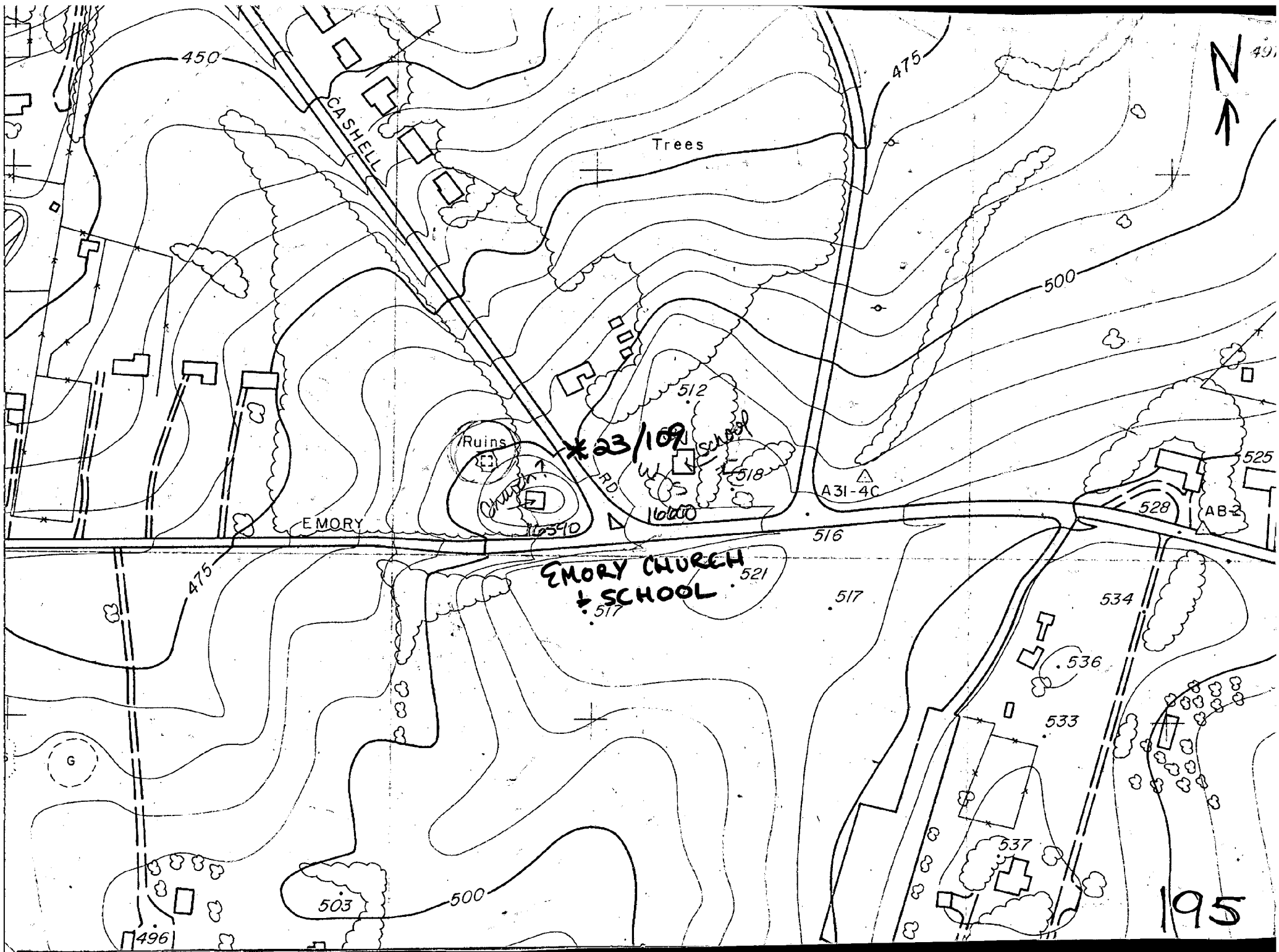

The Emory Church and School property is currently the site of two residential structures, both of which were built in the second quarter of this century. The two independent houses are located on adjacent lots at the intersection of Emory Lane and Cashell Road. The one house is a Colonial Revival Cape Cod, the other is a bungalow.

ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION

The house located on the site of the original Emory Church is a 1-1/2-story, three-bay, center-passage-plan house with a stone veneer. It is covered with a gable roof, featuring two gable dormers and an end chimney.

The house located on the site of Emory (later Oakdale) School, is a 1-1/2-story frame bungalow-type house. It is covered with a cross gable roof, is clad with weatherboard siding, and features a one-story porch with a shed roof. The roof is clad with asphalt shingles. Typical windows are placed singly and in pairs and feature 6/1 sash with square-edged trim.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The property called the Emory Church and School actually consists of two 20th-century residences, which are located on the site of the original Emory Methodist Church and Emory School, later known as Oakdale School. Although they occupy the site of the original church and school buildings¹, these residential structures have no other associations with Emory Methodist Church, and no architectural significance in their own right. The property does not meet the criteria of the Maryland Inventory of Historic Places or the National Register of Historic Places.

Historic Context

In November 1801, trustees for the Emory Methodist Church purchased seventy-five "perches" of land at the intersection of present-day Emory Lane and Cashell Road. The original church building was constructed on this site that same year with 14 members. According to secondary sources, this church was a small frame structure with handmade furnishings.² It is not known when the original school building was erected on the site. However, both the Emory Methodist Church and School House are clearly identified on Martenet and Bond's *Map of Montgomery County* (1865) and again on the G.M. Hopkins *Atlas of Montgomery County* (1879). According to these maps, the buildings are located in the vicinity of the present-day houses, though it is not clear if they are on the exact site.

In 1868, the church had a membership of 22. It was part of the Rockville Circuit in 1876, which also included Goshen, Brookeville, Rockville, Potomac Chapel, Concord, Gaithersburg and Barnesville. In 1914-15, a new church building, designed in a carpenter Gothic style, was erected on the east side of Georgia Avenue, just north of the original church site. Although the church retained ownership of the property until 1927, the chapel was used by farmer J.W. Barnsley in the interim. In 1915, according to a Mutual Fire Insurance Company policy taken out by J.W. Barnsley, "the old Emory Church [was] used as hay house." The property was insured for \$75.00 and the property's cash value was estimated at \$100.00. Based upon this information, it is clear that the original building on the site was demolished and replaced by the 1-1/2-story, three-

bay, Cap Cod-style house currently on the site.

In 1868, a State report indicates that there were 50 students at Emory School with Stacy T. Noland as teacher.³ In 1883, the school was apparently deeded to the County School Commissioners. An 1883 insurance policy on the school identifies it as a twelve-year-old structure, measuring 20' x 30' and located 30 yards east of the chapel. In 1908 a new building was approved for Emory, and in 1910 a new building, called Oakdale, was insured for \$475. In 1928, the school was closed with community approval and in 1929, the site was sold to Daniel W. Bonds for \$1,050.

Based upon this transaction, it seems that the original school building was demolished and replaced by the 1-1/2-story, frame, bungalow-type house presently on the site, probably around the time of the sale, or thereafter.

November 4, 1801 Samuel Beall and Edward Owen and wife convey to Trustees for Emory Methodist Church. (Referenced in Deed Book 434 Folio 449)

Purchase of 75 perches of land on the west corner of Emory Lane and Cashell Road. Original Church built on this site with 14 members.

October, 1868 Emory Methodist Church (Rockville Circuit) reports 22 members.

November 4, 1914 Cornerstone laid for the new Oakdale Emory Methodist Episcopal Church on Georgia Avenue. The 1.75 acres was granted to the trustees by John P. Ray Jr. and wife and Caroline E. Murphy. (Deed Book 248 Folio 256)

1915 Mutual Assurance Society Policy #55784 written March 19, 1915 states "The Old Emory Church bought by J.W. Barnesley used as hay house."

1921 Mutual Assurance Society Policy #64064 written February 26, 1921 designates the Church is still being used as a "hay barrack"

August 15, 1927 James W. Barnesley, Myrtle Barnesley, Edwin Stonestreet, Lee-Adamson, E.S. Barnesley and L.W. White (Present Board of Trustees) sold the previous church building and land to Frank Junghans. (Deed Book 434 Folio 449)

May 24, 1939 James P. Junghans et al, Plaintiffs (VS) John L. Junghans et al, Defendants.

Robert Peter, William Prettyman and Thomas C. Kelly were appointed trustees to sell the land decreed to be sold. (Equity Case #8666)

June 28, 1939

Trustees sold the property to W. Brooke Johns at a public sale for \$1,925.00. 4.67 acres. (Deed Book 772 Folio 199)

June 28, 1960

W. Brooke Johns and Hazel M. Johns to Jocelyn S. Stobbs. 4.67 acres (Deed Book 2758 Folio 276)

December 8, 1970

Jocelyn S. Stobbs to Zane E. Naibert and Janice R. Naibert. Present Owners. 3.0209 acres. (Deed Book 4025 Folio 511)

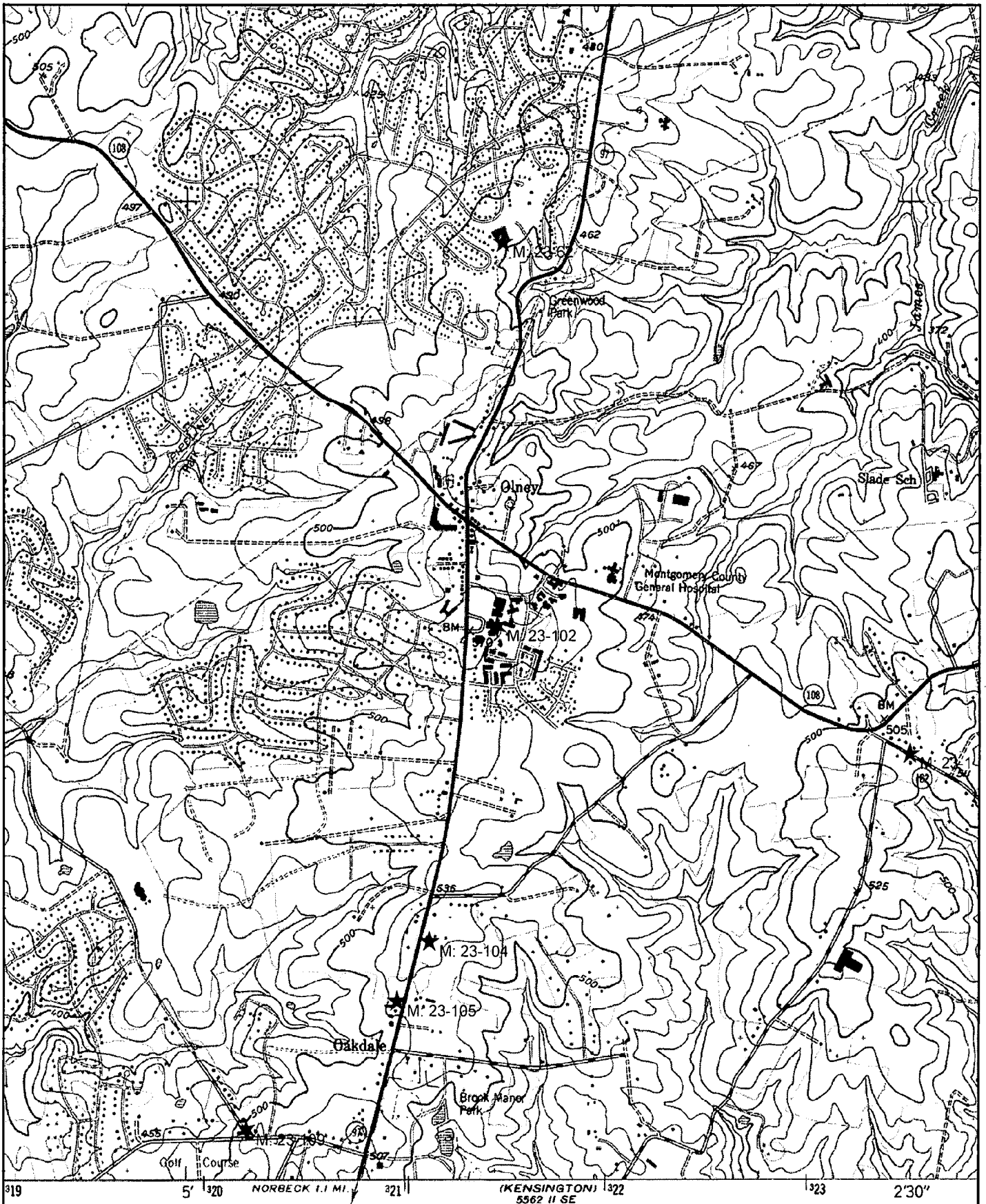

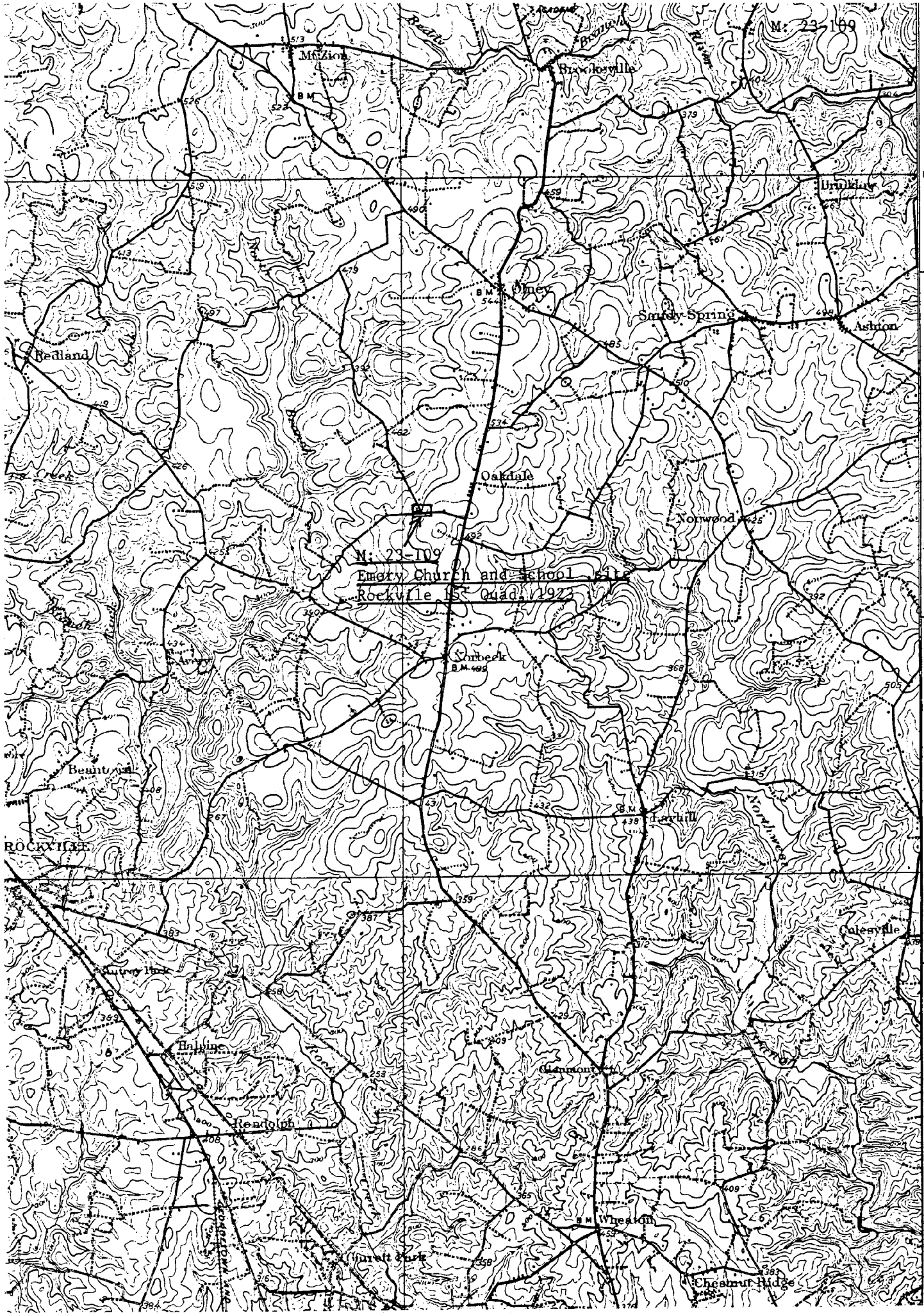

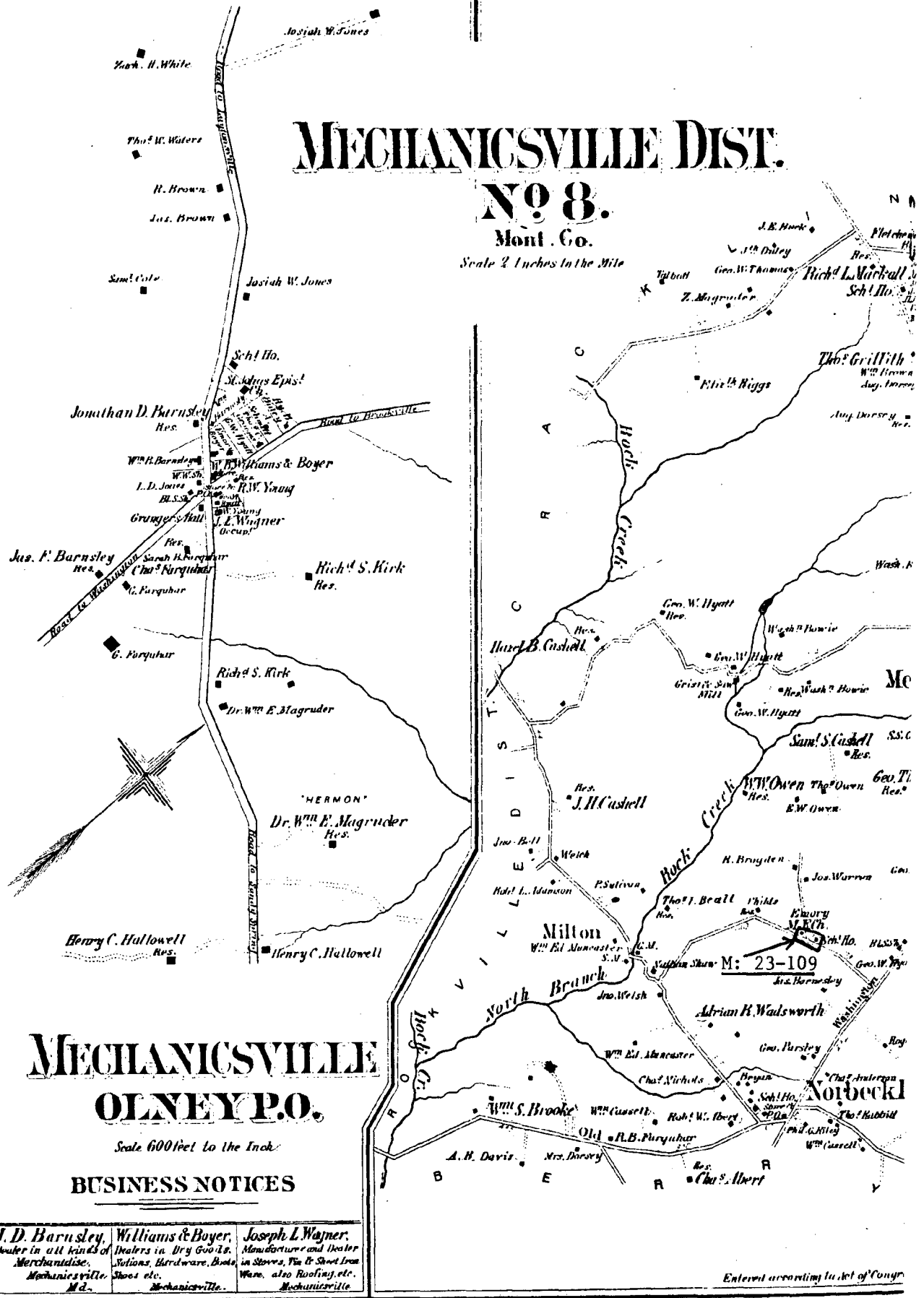
