ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Richard Lea House is a two-story, four-bay, gable-roofed frame structure with two, two-story, two-bay, gable-roofed frame additions appended to it in a telescopic-like manner. These three parts of the house have unpainted, weatherboard walls, gable roofs clad with asphalt shingles and all new vinyl windows in various configurations of 1/1 double-hung sash and casements, either singly or in groups of three. A shed-roof porch extends across the front of the main block, while a glass-enclosed greenhouse has been built in front of the middle block of the house.

Exterior:

The house has been enlarged towards the rear, whereby the rear slope of the gable roof of the main block was re-built and extended to cover a two-story addition across the rear of the dwelling. A deck and shed-roof porch have been added to the middle of the three blocks. The end section of the house retains its original two-bay-two-story massing, but has all new openings, including a large "Palladian" window in the second story of the exposed gable end.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Richard Lea House, built circa 1879, was originally part of a grist and saw mill operation run by various members of the Lea family in the mid-to late 19th century. However, because the mill buildings no longer exist, and the dwelling itself stands in a much-altered and compromised state, the property no longer retains sufficient integrity to appropriately convey its association with the past. The property thus does not meet the criteria of the Maryland Inventory of Historic Properties or the National Register of Historic Places.

<u>Historic Context:</u>

The land upon which the Richard Lea House stands was originally part of a larger tract patented to George Stabler. By the mid-19th century, as indicated on the 1865 Martenet and Bond Map of Montgomery County, a Thomas J. Lea lived in the immediate vicinity of the Richard Lea House, on the west side of the Patuxent River in Montgomery County, and directly across from what is today Howard County. A grist mill, located near Lea's property on the Patuxent River, may or may not have been operated by him.

On the 1879 G.M. Hopkins Atlas of Montgomery County, the grist and saw mill is still on the site, and a new residence, identified as that of Richard and Henry Lea, is across the road from the grist and saw mill. Henry T. Lea is listed in the Hopkins atlas as a butcher and farmer and owner of 108 acres of land in the Sandy Spring area. Several other Lea family members, including Thomas J. Lea, own property in the greater vicinity of Brighton. Thomas J. Lea is listed in the 1879 atlas as a miller and farmer, and owner of 160 acres in Brighton.

In 1881, Richard Lea sold the property back to George Stabler, who in turn passed it on to Philip t. Stabler and James B. Henderson. Stabler and Henderson retained the property until 1890, at which point it changed hands twice in two weeks: first to Merritt M. and Lydia W. Haviland, and then to Arthur F. Lawrence and wife. This latter deed refers to the property as being "improved by a dwelling house, mill and outbuildings." In 1900, Arthur F. Lawrence and his wife convey the property to Sarah M.E. Haviland, who, along with Merritt M.; Lydia W.; and Ebenezer W. retain the property until 1919. It is obviously during the Haviland's ownership of the property that the road leading to the mill was dubbed Haviland Mill Road.

In 1945, the owners of the Richard Lea House defaulted on their


The house is a two story frame structure built in several sections. The foundations are all field-stone.
