(2) *Architectural and design significance.* The historic resource:

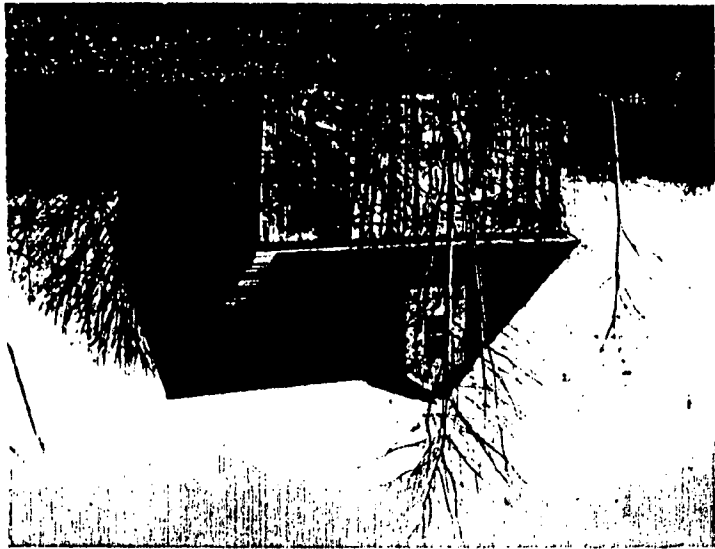
a. Embodies the distinctive characteristics of a type, period or method of construction;

b. Represents the work of a master;

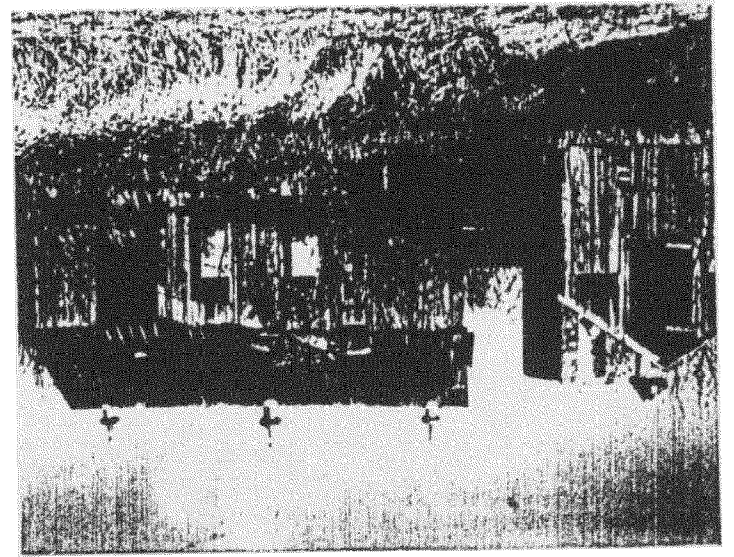
c. Possesses high artistic values;

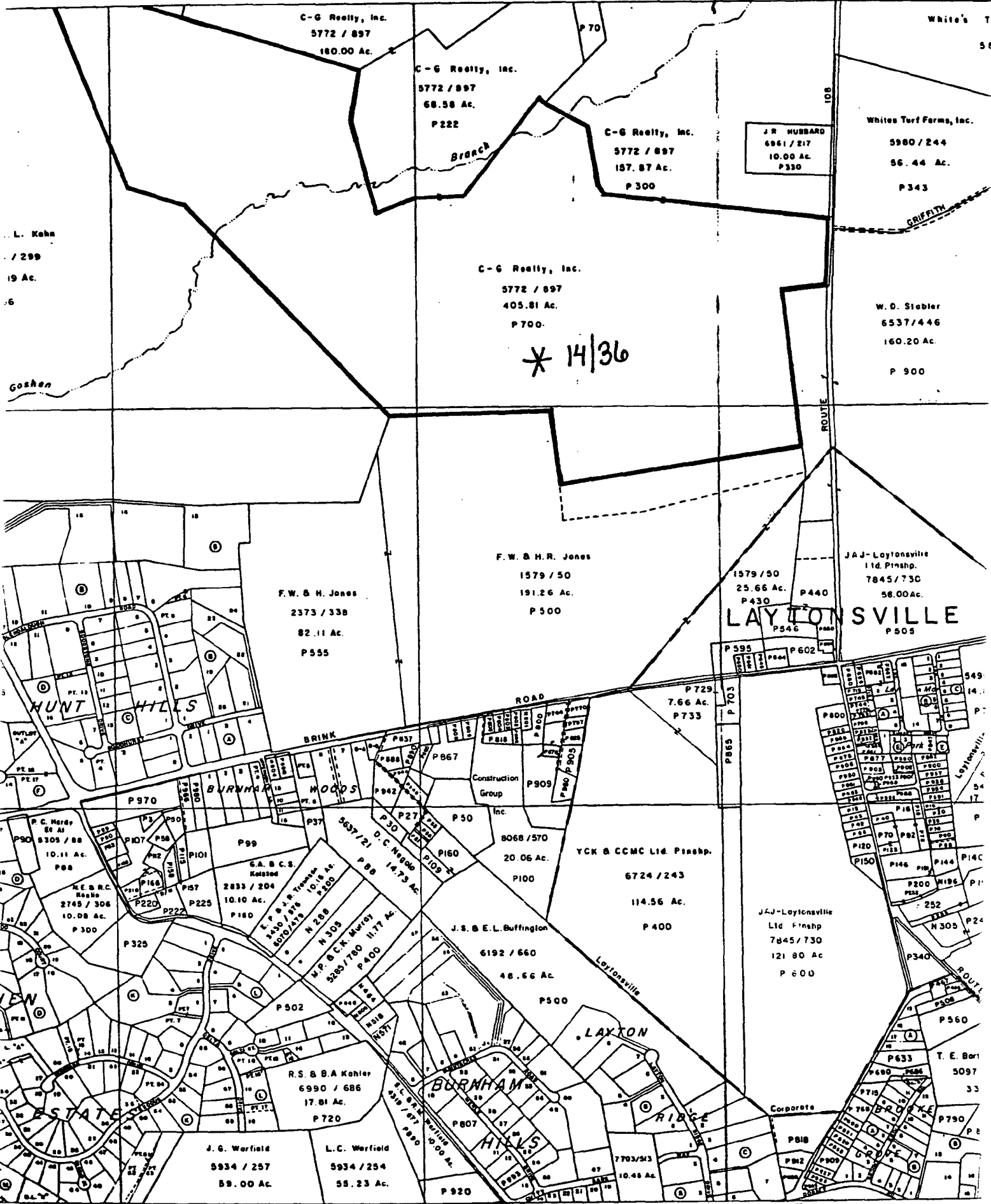
d. Represents a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction; or



→ The Commission found that these sites did not meet any of the criteria of the Ordinance, and therefore, it recommends that they not be added to the Master Plan.

Owners of these sites were not notified due to the difficulty in locating accurate legal descriptions and premise addresses. Planning Board staff has indicated that notice of your public hearing will be advertised. Our legal council has advised us that such notification is sufficient.

The Commission will have a representative attend your public hearing and work session on these sites. Please do not hesitate to call either Bobbi Hahn or myself in the interim if we can provide any additional information.

Church; 11/7 Sheckles Log Tobacco house (demolished); 10/51 Soper log house (demolished); 28/4 Stabler ruins; 15/22 Stanley House (demolished); 12/30 Stone chimney ruins; 23/7 Stone springhouse ruins; 11/18 Warfield log tobacco house; 10/53 Watkins log house; 10/56 Ziegler stone house (foundation only); 12/39 Mary Fisher farm; 17/36 Isaac Fyffe; 14/46 Allin log tobacco house; 15/7 Brown's log tobacco house and spring house; 10/75 Bank Barn; 22/10 Barn; 13/2 Beall Barn; 22/16 Grandby farm outbuildings; 10/14 Ingalls farm; 14/36 Old Pope farm (barn); 10/45 A.J. → MOTION: Ms. McGuckian moved that it be recommended to the Planning Board that the above listed sites should not be placed on the Master Plan because they did not meet any of the criteria of the Ordinance. Mr. Patterson seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

## II. Hearings on Historic Area Work Permits

1. Mrs. Hahn reviewed the plans for new construction at 2813 Beechbank Road, Silver Spring, which is within the Capitol View Park historic district, as presented to the Commission at its November 3, 1983 meeting by owner/developer Richard Pokrass. The Local Advisory Committee had recommended adoption of the plans as presented with the condition that no additional trees be removed.

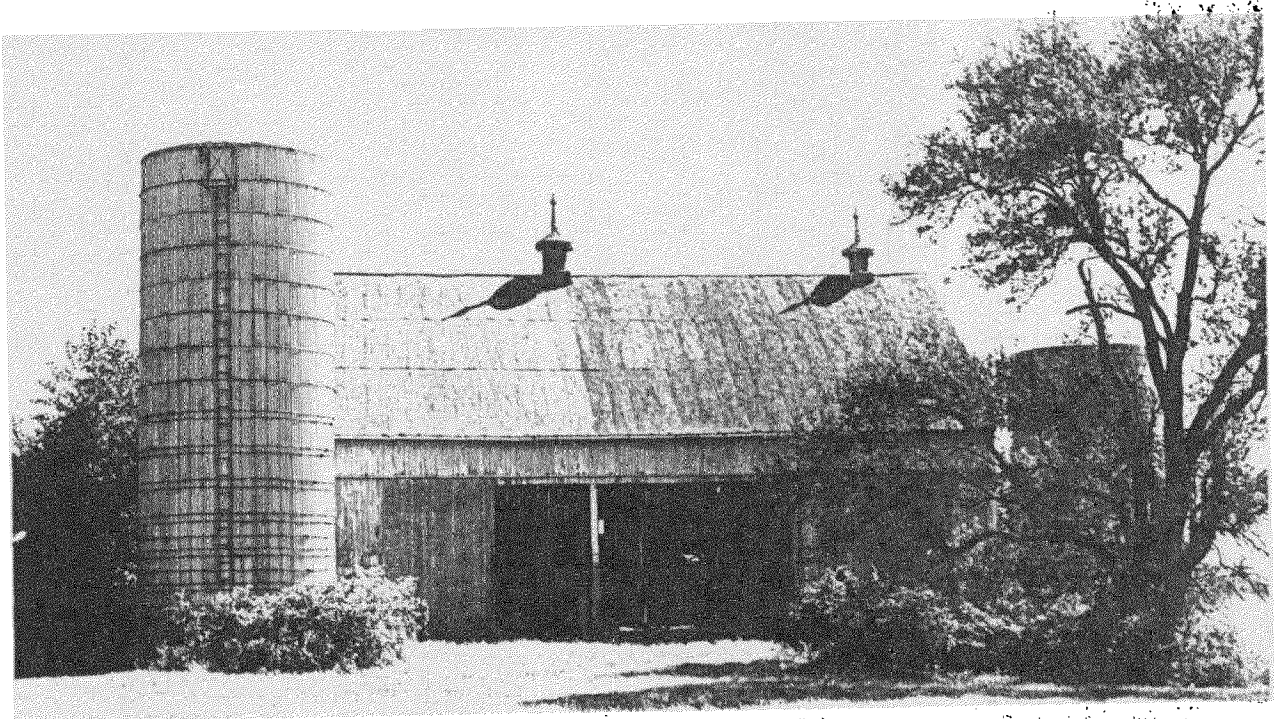
