DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a two-story, T-shaped frame house that now sits in the middle of a subdivision. The main (north) section has three bays, with the entrance in the east end bay. The door itself has transom and sidelights. The tall windows are 6/6, with molded board cornices. A two-story, four-columned, open porch of modern construction covers this facade. The roof is standing-s~~pan~~ metal, and chimneys are centered on the ridge of both the main and east sections of the house. The chimney stacks are slimmer than the wide bases they rest on.

A newer, low, two-story wing extends from the SW corner of the main house. Present siding is aluminum.

Prepare both a summary paragraph of significance and a general statement of history and support.

The Albert Stewart house is a large mid-nineteenth century vernacular dwelling. The house, which includes some attractive architectural detailing (such as the original six over six light windows with molded cornices and an entrance with paneled door, transom and sidelights) has been glamorized by the addition of a two story front porch supported by four large columns. Although this porch is not in keeping with the original style of this type of dwelling, it is not an unattractive addition. It reflects a change in architectural trends from the nineteenth into the twentieth century (and perhaps a rise in the affluence of the owners).

The house was probably built by William Thompson of R. about 1861.¹ William's wife, Chloe received the property on which the house was built after the death of Chloe's father, Nathaniel Pope. Nathaniel died in 1842 leaving half his farm to Chloe and the other half to William in trust for his daughter, Eveline Stewart.² William, a farmer and judge of the Orphans Court, died in January of 1872.³ According to William's last will and testament, the farm became the property of Chloe, to be passed on after her death to Albert R. Stewart (who received his mother's share of the property in 1876).⁴ Chloe and her nephew, Albert, evidently both lived in the house until their respective deaths. Albert, a well known farmer, died in March of 1907.⁵ Chloe died in 1911 at which point the farm became the property of Albert's two daughters, Mary Magruder and Ann Martin.

Mary and her husband, William, lived in the house for a while until it could be sold by a court appointed trustee and the proceeds divided between the two heirs. The farm was described in the notice of sale in 1911 as approximately 240 acres, half cleared and under cultivation with the balance in pine, oak and chestnut timber. It was improved by a large eight room dwelling, a barn, corn house, granary and other necessary outbuildings as well as a six room tenant house. In Addition, there was a well of water at each house.⁶

14-62 William Thompson of R and Chloe Pope Thompson House

Chloe Pope, daughter of Nathaniel Pope, married William Thompson of R. Nathaniel Pope died in 1842, leaving half of estate to Chloe and half to [William in trust for Eveline Stewart, daughter of William and Chloe.] (MHT form—last section doesn't make sense) Eveline or Analine was apparently sister of Chloe.

Chloe's husband, William Thompson of R., was a Judge of the Orphans Court. He died in January 1872 after a long illness.

Emaline, widow of John Middleton Stewart, and daughter of Nathaniel Pope, died Jan 10, 1878, age 63. Buried at Goshen ME Church South. (Genealogical Abstracts, 1855-1899. Name alternatively spelled Analine in Scharf History of Western Maryland, p719)

Albert R. Stewart was son of Analine and John. He inherited his mother's share of property and lived there with aunt Chloe. Albert died at the age of 60 in 1907. (Genealogical Abstracts, 1900-1934) Chloe died at age 94, in 1911, "at the home of her niece, Mrs. William Magruder, near Laytonsville". (Ibid. The niece, born Mary Stewart Magruder, inherited the Thompson House with her sister—see below.) The property was sold in 1912. (MHT form)

Unknown who was Albert's wife. He had two daughters Mary Magruder and Ann Martin. Mary married William. (MHT form) Ann's husband was Asbury Martin of Baltimore. They married in December 1875 "at the home of the bride's uncle, William Thompson of R, deceased of Goshen." (Genealogical Abstracts, 1855-1899)

Charles F. Windham purchased the farm in September of 1912 for \$8,893.50.⁷ The property remained in the family until about 1931. It was owned by Dwight and Mildred Burnham from 1935 until 1858. Dwight, a certified public accountant working in D.C., also ran a farm here which was referred to as "Burnham Wood."⁹ After 1958 the property passed through a succession of owners until 1968 when it was purchased by the present owners, Norman and Patrica Price.¹⁰ The house now sits on a one acre lot surrounded by the "Goshen Estates" sub-division.

¹The date given is based on the date that improvements are listed on this property in the tax assessment records, the appearance of the house and the fact that it is shown on both the 1865 and 1878 maps. In addition, the present owners stated that when remodeling the interior of the house they found an artifact in a portion of the house which was marked 1876. Presumably, the house is at least that old.

WINDHAM FARM

1912 to 1931

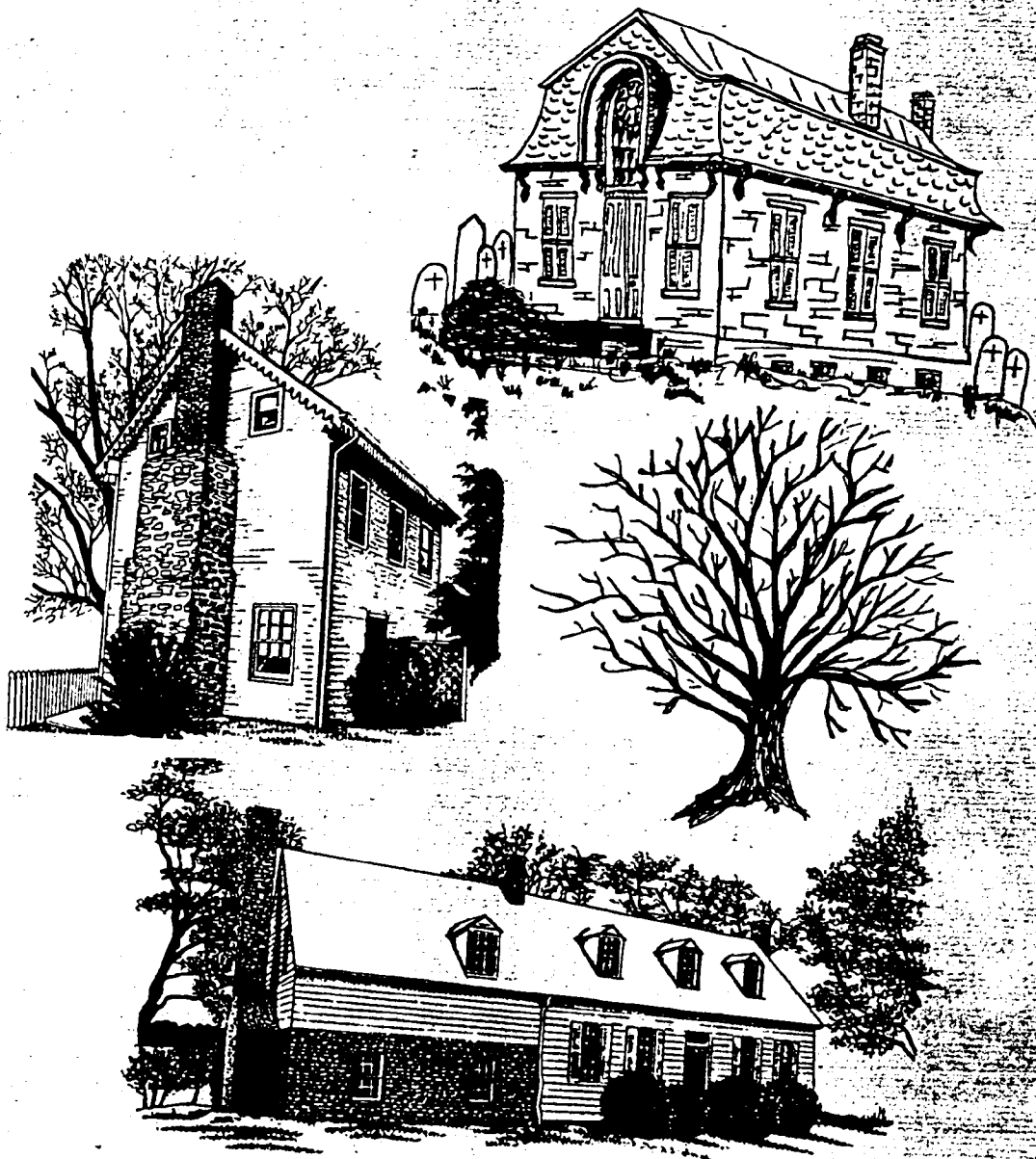
Windham Farm was one of the later farms in the Goshen area and was occupied by the Windham family from 1876 to 1936. After this sixty year occupancy, the Burnhams purchased the farm. Because Mrs. Burnham was very civic minded and active in the Republican Party, she became well known in the area. The local people began to refer to the section of Route 124 where the farm was located as Burnham Road. This part of the road is located between Warfield Road and the Brink Road/Route 124 intersection.

During the 1950's and 1960's, the home was occupied by the Jack Watson Golden family. The lane that led from Route 124 to the farmhouse was lined with apple trees. This lane had replaced a former approach also from Route 124 which had brick posts at the entrance that were crumbling with age. This pathway was overgrown and impassable. During the Golden occupancy, there still remained, on the property, a small stone building that was slightly rounded. It had a dirt floor and a wooden door with an iron barred window. It was believed to have been the slave quarters from earlier days. On this farm, the Golden family operated the Rod/Gar Kennels where they boarded dogs and other animals.

The farmhouse, which was last restored by the Norman Price family, is located on Delta Court in Goshen Estates.

Dear Property Owner,

Historic preservation planning staff is beginning the evaluation of historic resources in the Goshen-Damascus area. The historic evaluation of these properties is taking place at this time because of the upcoming update of the Damascus Area Master Plan that is scheduled to begin in the next year.

Records indicate that you are the owner of the Albert Stewart House, at 22 Delta Court (Resource #14/62). Your property was identified on the 1976 *Locational Atlas and Index of Historic Sites* as being of potential historic significance, or was noted by planning staff as being of potential historic merit. Staff will be visiting each of the 60 sites under consideration, to document the property with photographs. If you would like us to make an appointment with you for this site visit, please call our office at 301-563-3400.

Evaluation of historic resources is a careful process, as the enclosed chart reveals. The Historic Preservation Commission, Planning Board, and County Council review each property, evaluating every proposed designation to see whether it meets Historic Preservation Ordinance criteria for historic or architectural significance that would warrant its protection. Each reviewing body holds public hearings, with the County Council having the final say on all designations. Not all nominated properties are designated. Over 425 resources have been found to be ineligible for designation and have been removed from the *Locational Atlas*. The entire evaluation process typically takes about one year.

Historic designation helps to manage change, so that new construction or landscaping is accomplished in sympathy to the historic character of a property. The enclosed brochure explains in more detail the effects of designation, including tax credits that are available for restoration work.

Site visits and photographic documentation are the first step in researching historic properties. Staff will also be consulting land records, tax assessments, family histories, and other documents. Staff will summarize findings in a Maryland Historical Trust inventory form for each property.
